Subject: Child Development Survey Results, Spring 2015

Important highlights include:

- 41% of the respondents were first year (but not first quarter) students, with 83% of the respondents declaring their major as Child Development/Education. (Question 2 & 3)
- 45% of the respondents identify as Asian or Pacific Islander. (Question 6)
- 50% of the respondents indicated that they would attend classes between 4:00PM-7:00PM if offered, 44% would attend classes between 9:00AM and noon, 30% would attend classes on Saturday, 25% would attend classes between noon and 3:00PM, 24% would attend classes on Friday evenings, and 16% would attend classes between 7:30AM and 9:00AM. (Question 10)
- In comparison to the survey conducted in 2014, 57% of respondents in 2014 selected that they would attend classes between 9:00AM and noon, 47% selected classes between 4:00PM and 7:00PM, 31% selected classes between noon and 3:00PM, 24% selected classes both on Saturday and classes between 7:30AM and 9:00AM, and 13% selected Friday evening classes.
- 47% of the respondents indicated that Advising in the Child Development major would help them as students to become more successful, along with 34% indicating a Study Skills class to be a helpful option, and 23% indicating tutorial services as a helpful option. Of the student services used on campus 55% reported they have used counseling. (Question 16 & 7)
- 38% of the respondents felt that work and/or family obligations posed the biggest challenge to their success. Compared to a similar survey conducted in Spring 2014, where 40% of respondents felt that work and/or family obligations posed the biggest challenge to their success. (Question 20)
- 52% of the respondents found structured small group activities to be helpful in becoming a more effective learner, 44% chose exploration and hands-on activities, 41% chose multi-media, 42% chose lecture and discussion, and 40% chose group projects or presentations as an effective teaching method to help them be a more effective learner. In a similar survey conducted in Spring 2014, 20% of respondents found lecture and discussion to be helpful in becoming a more effective learner and 19% chose exploration and hands-on activities. (Question 21)
- 38% of the respondents indicated that they first heard about the Child Development program through word of mouth, and 27% attributed their knowledge about the Child Development program to the College Catalog/ Schedule of Classes. (Question 22)

- 51% of respondents reported they “strongly agree” that the courses in Child Development at De Anza College prepared them to work in a high quality early childhood program. (Question 24)
- 59% of respondents reported “very much”; that their experience in Child Development at De Anza College prepared them to communicate the developmental and behavioral needs of young children. Compared to a survey conducted in Spring 2014, 60% reported that the Child Development program “very much” prepared them to communicate the developmental and behavioral needs of young children. (Question 28)

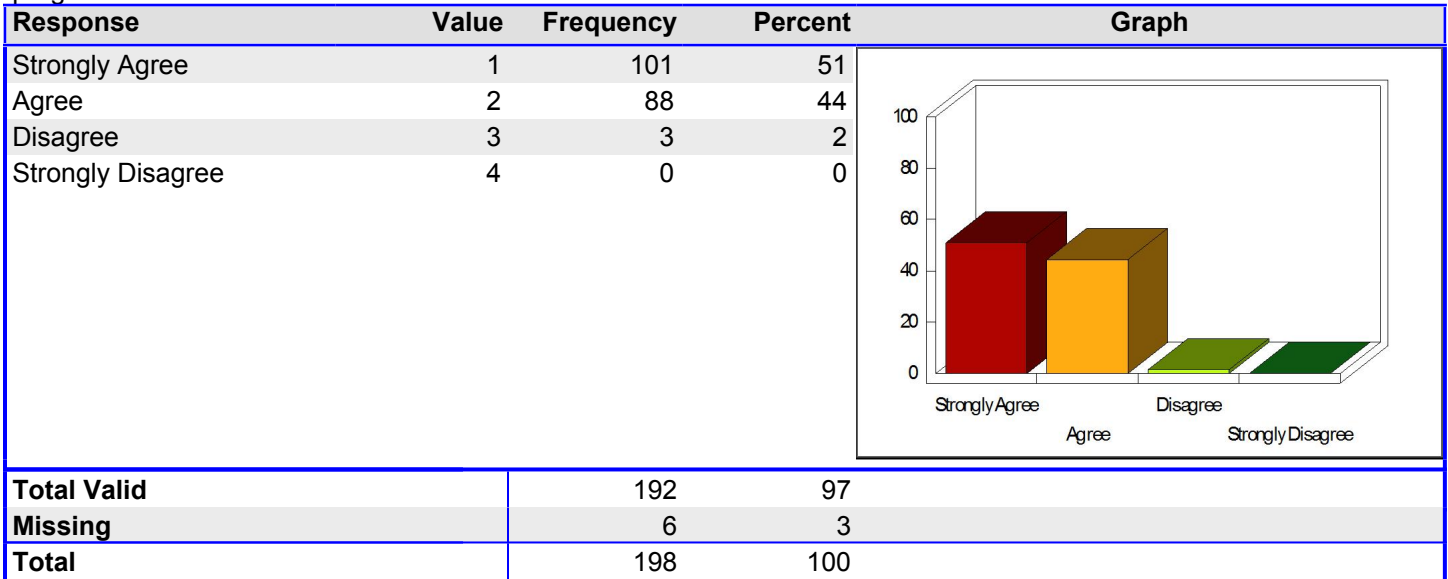

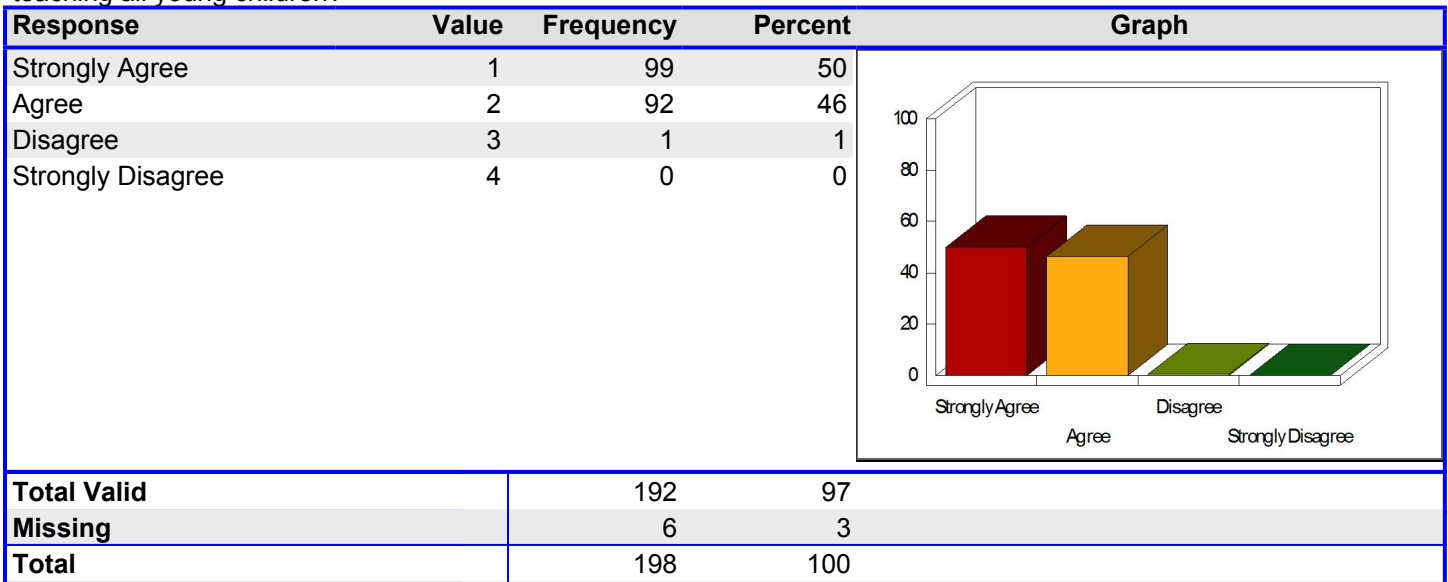
24. Did the courses in CD at De Anza College prepare you to work in a high quality early childhood program?

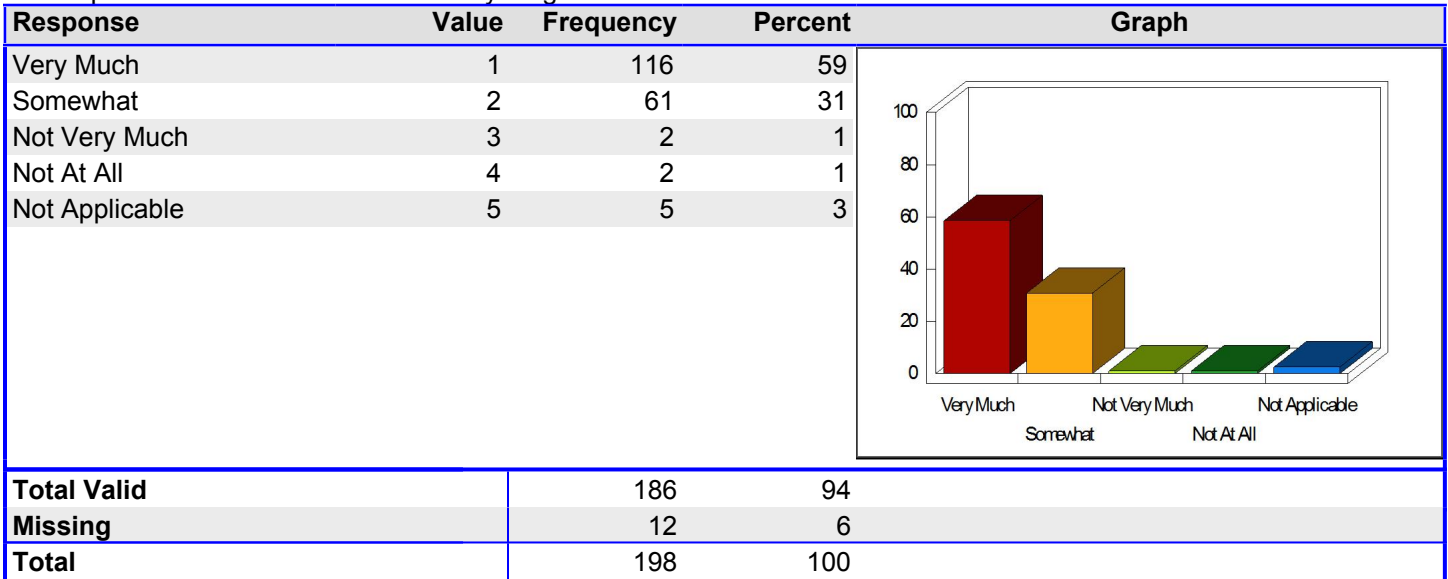

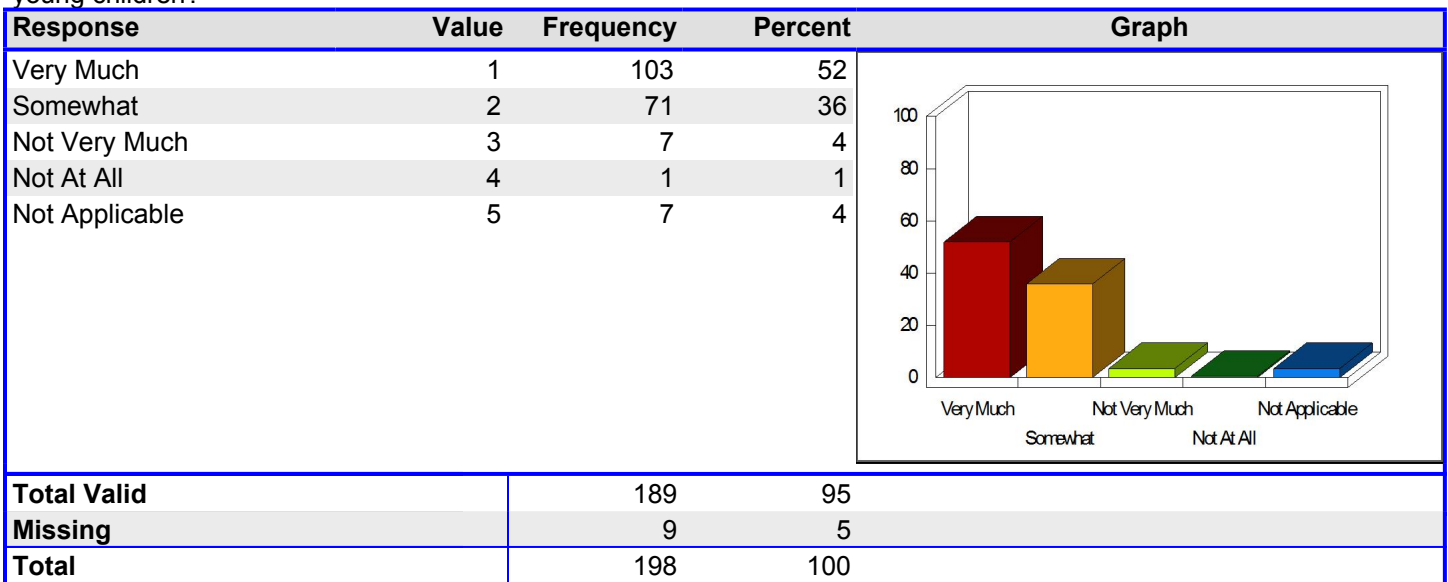
28. How much has your experience in CD at De Anza College prepared you to communicate the developmental and behavioral needs of young children?

29. How much has your experience in CD at De Anza College prepared you to evaluate the development of young children?

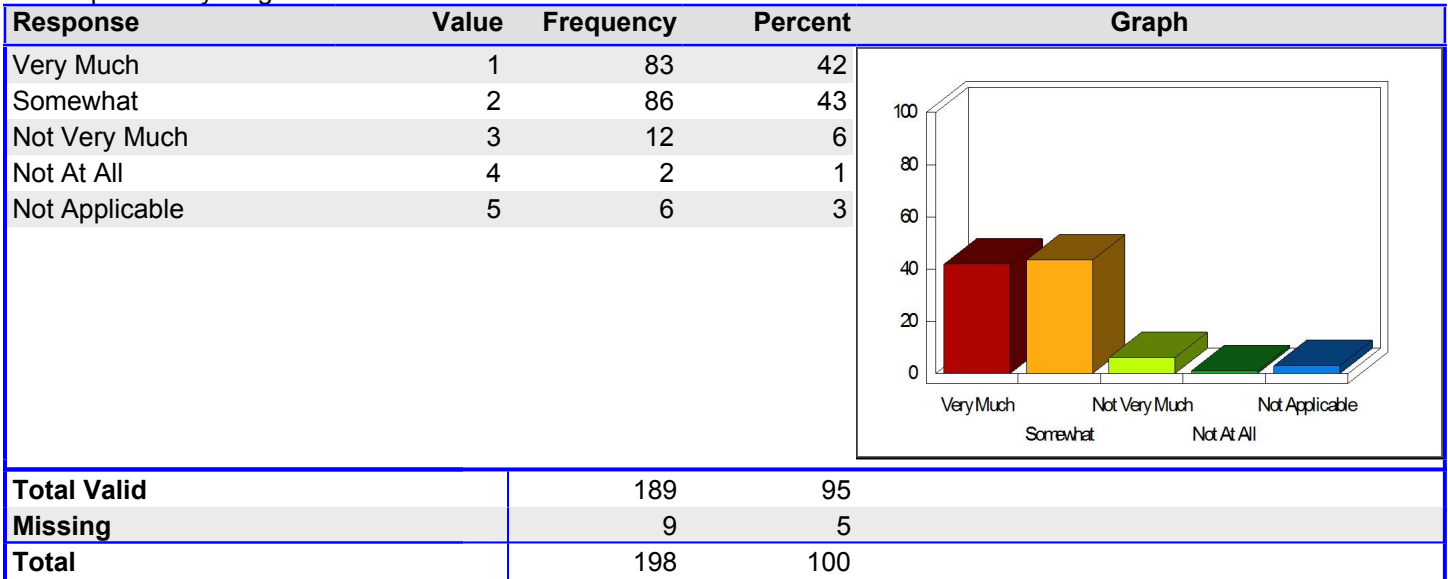

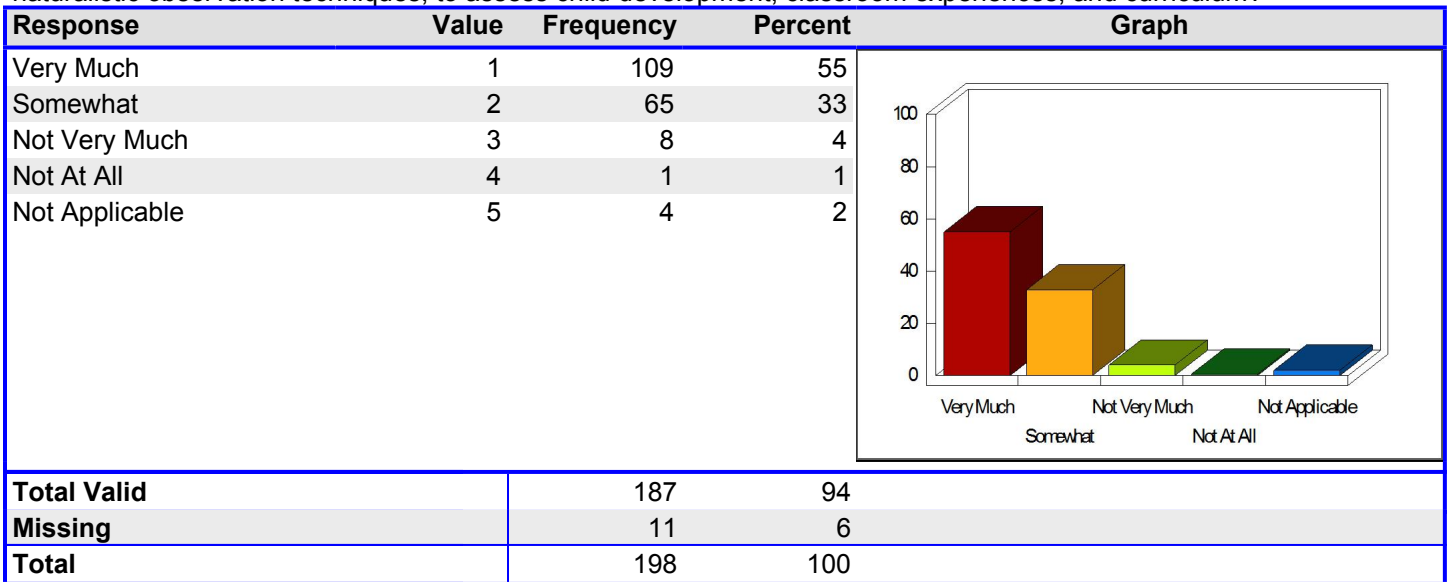
30. How much has your experience in CD at De Anza College prepared you to identify atypical development in young children?

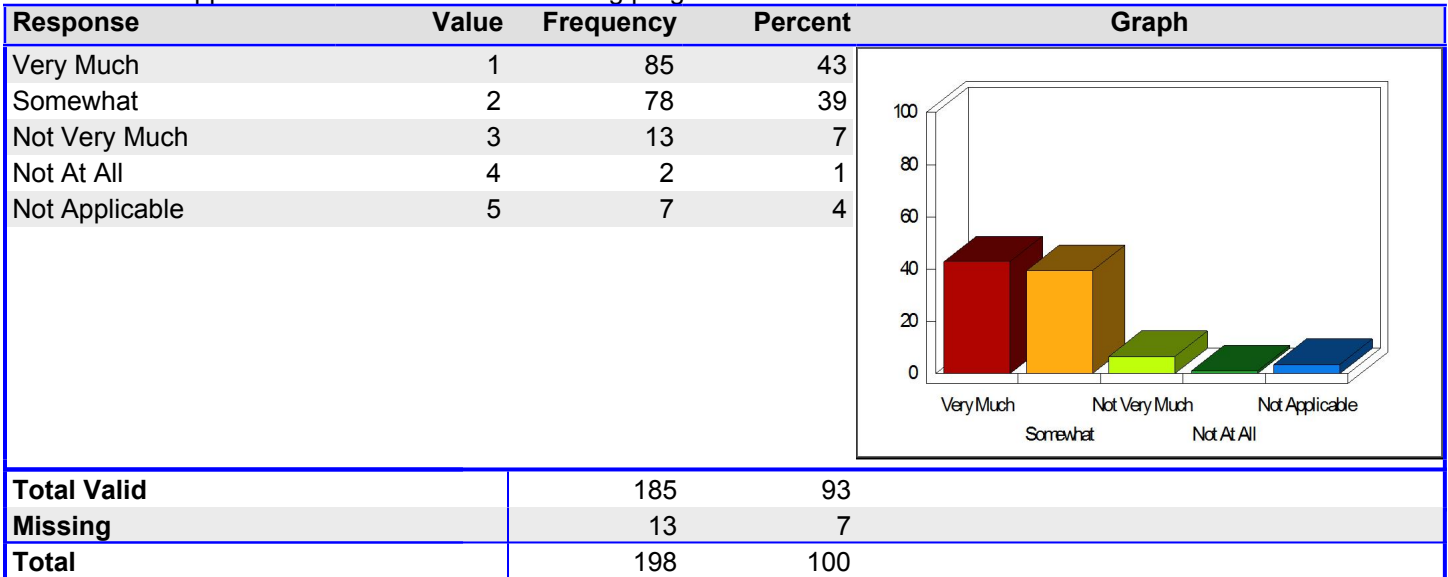

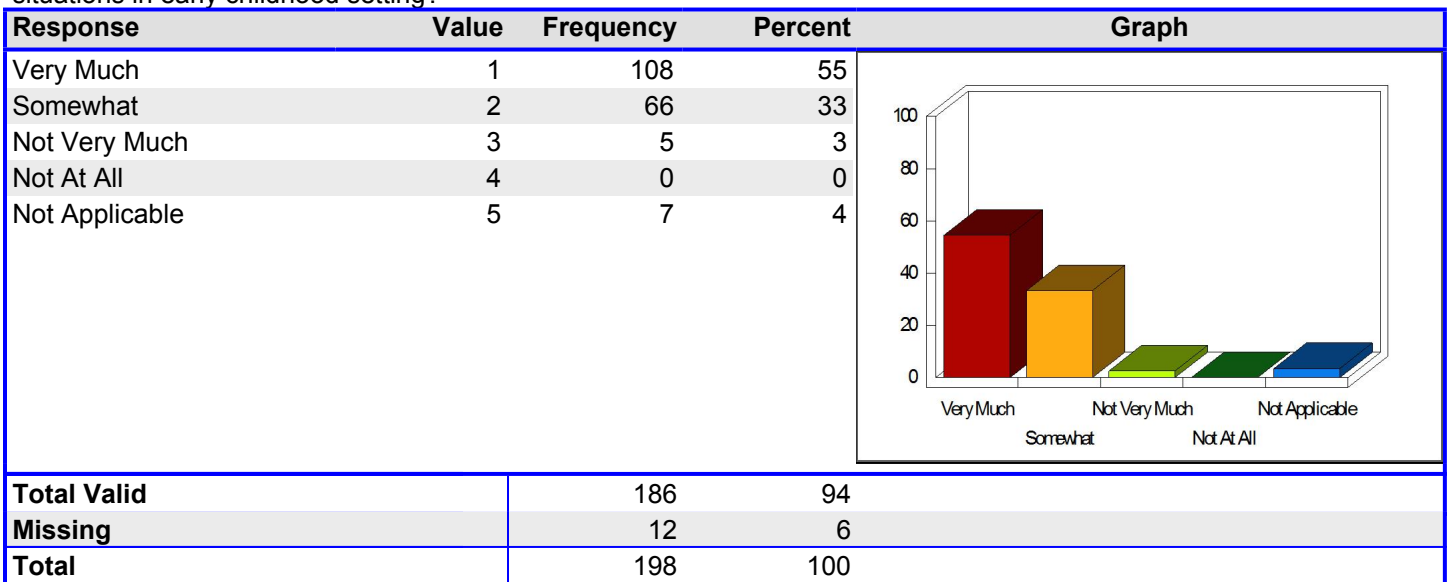
32. How much has your experience in CD at De Anza College prepared you to identify community resources to support children and families in solving programmatic dilemmas?

33. How much has your experience in CD at De Anza College help you to adapt ideas and methods to new situations in early childhood setting?

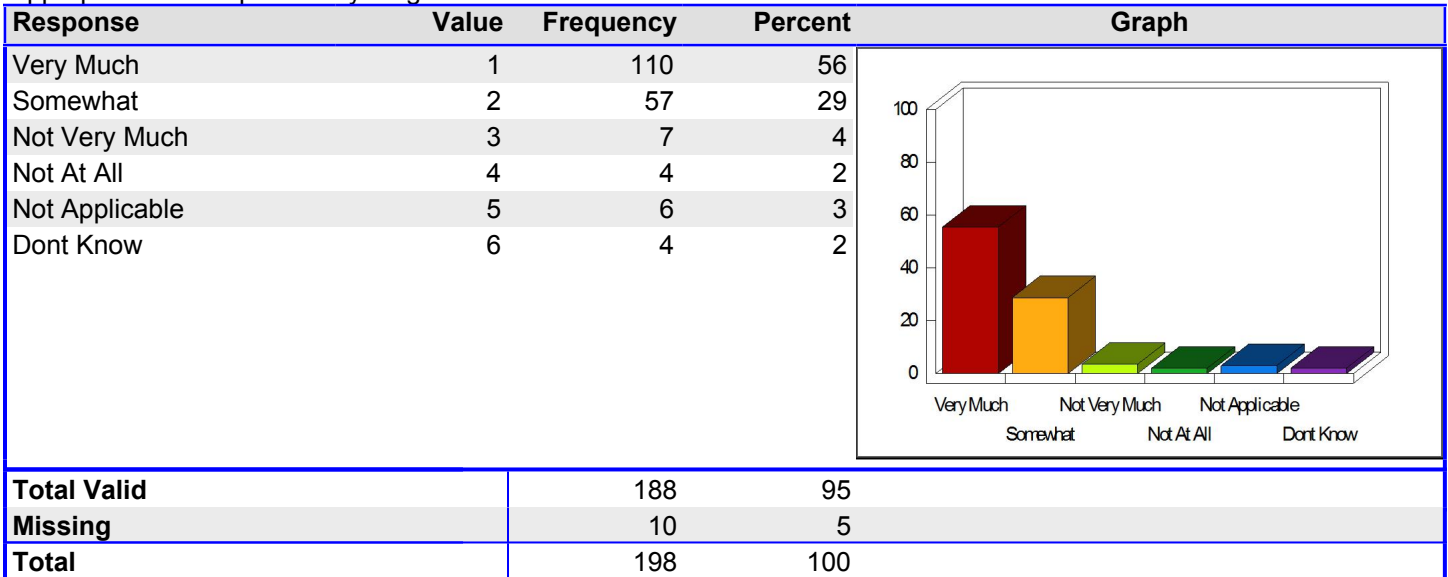

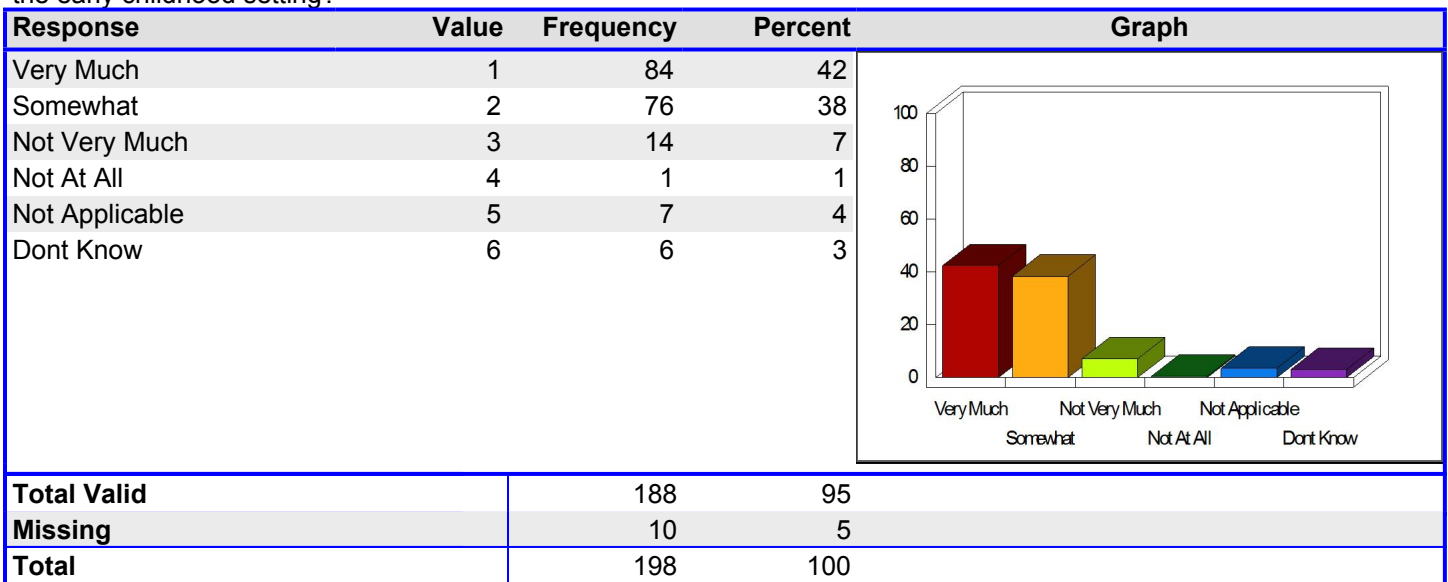
34. How much has your experience in De Anza College prepared you to create developmentally appropriate lesson plans for young children?

35. How much has your experience in CD at De Anza College prepared you to solve ethical dilemmas in the early childhood setting?

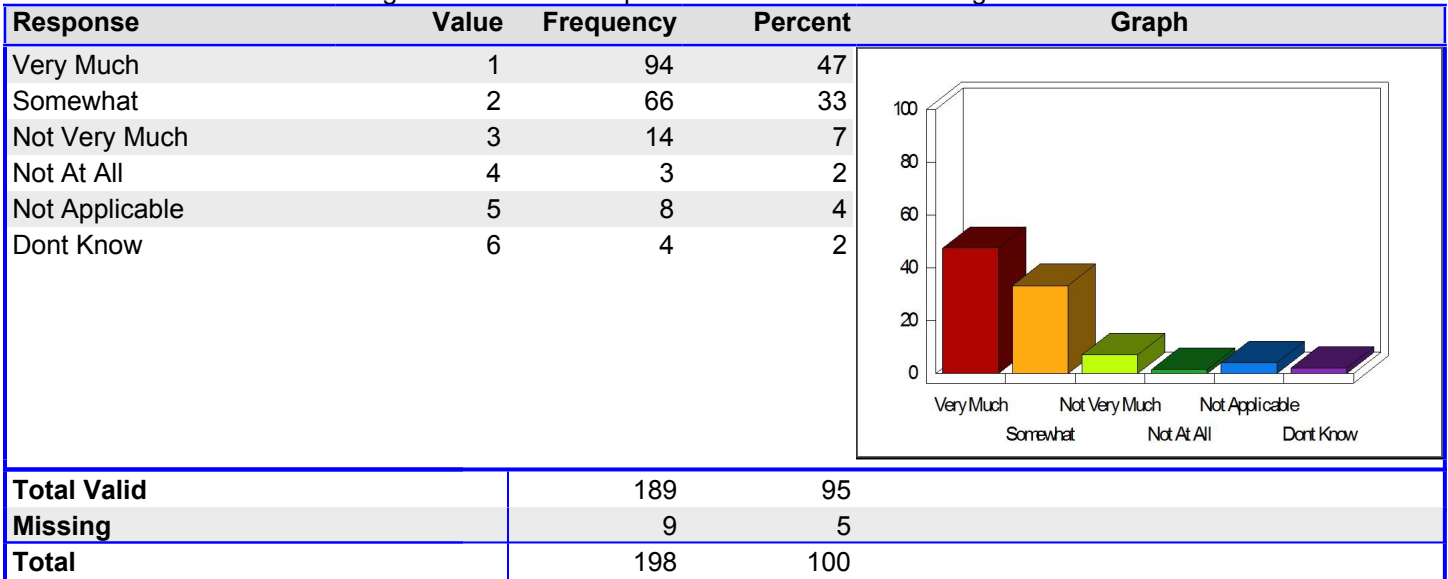

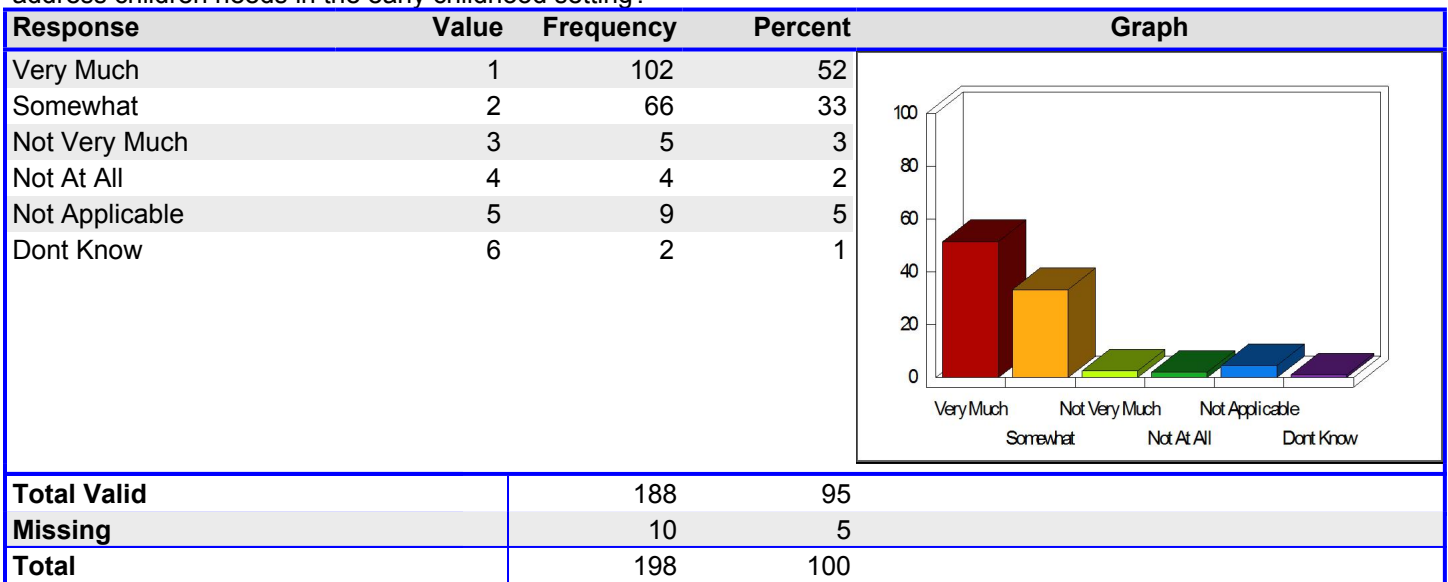
36. How much has your experience in CD at De Anza College prepared you to explore with parents different scenarios to addressing their child's developmental or behavioral challenges?
