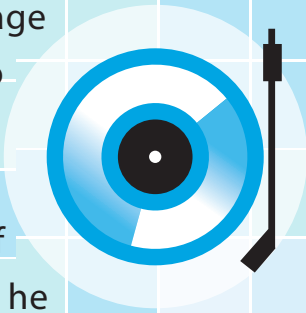

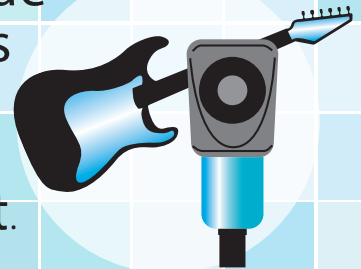
About

Earth Amplified

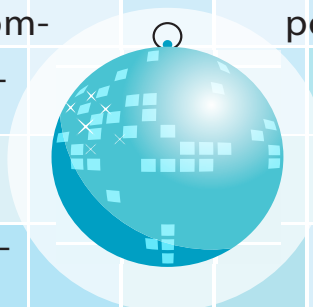

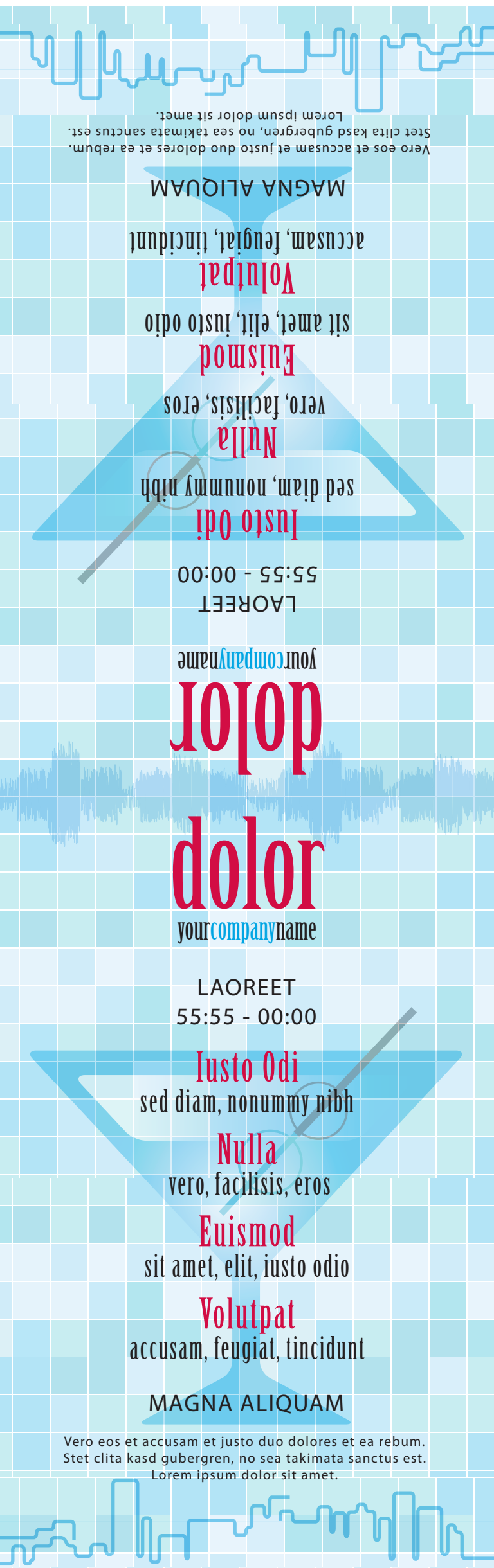
