In Class Essay:

Prompt 1:

In "Communication Between Men and Women," Alex Thio argues that men and women speak in different "genderlects," often leading to miscommunication. Explain to what extent you agree or disagree with the author. Your essay should have a clearly articulated thesis statement with sufficient supporting details from the text. Adequate use of summary, paraphrase, and quotations from the text is recommended. You may also draw on personal experience/examples to support your thesis.

OR

Prompt 2:

Thio states that men and women play a different game of proxemics² in their interactions often leading to polarity. Explain to what extent you agree or disagree with the author. Your essay should have a clearly articulated thesis statement with sufficient supporting details from the text. Adequate use of summary, paraphrase, and quotations from the text is recommended. You may also draw on personal experience/examples to support your thesis.

Some reflection questions to guide you:

- Does your essay have an introduction with a clearly stated thesis? Do you introduce the author and text?
- Are you creating logic and flow in your paragraphs by looking carefully at passages and focusing your ideas?
- Do you use accurate MLA format for your in-text citations to complement your summaries, paraphrases, or quotes?
- Are you integrating your own ideas with textual evidence?
- Are your paragraphs well developed?
- Is your writing legible?
