Image = a word or series of words that refers to any sensory experience. The following terms help us describe specific kinds of imagery:

Visual, auditory, tactile, olfactory, gustatory.

Checklist on Imagery:

- List a poem's key images in the order they appear.
- What does the poem's title suggest? Does it help you interpret the images?
- Remember, images can draw from all five senses, not just visual.
- List key adjectives or other qualifying words.
- What emotions or attitudes are suggested by the images?
- Does the tone stay the same, or shift, or progress?
- How do the poem's images "add up" to its theme?
