Welcome to

<u>Beginning Acoustic Guitar</u>. This course assumes no previous experience with either guitar or any other musical instrument.

Student Learning Outcome (from Course Outline): Successful students will be able to perform several chord progressions in different keys using both strumming and fingerstyle techniques.

Ron's Course objectives: By the term's end, you will

- be able to read guitar tablature
- be able to read easy guitar music in the first position (the open strings and first four frets of the guitar)
- be able to play-and understand the underlying concepts behind--chord progressions in different keys
- be able to use several techniques for playing the guitar, including strumming, pick technique, single note playing, and fingerstyle (arpeggio)
- be able to construct and play a major scale, a pentatonic minor scale
- be able to play various song forms, including the blues
- understand (and hopefully use) effective practice habits

<u>Blues, Jazz, and Popular Guitar</u>. This class assumes completion of Beginning Acoustic Guitar, or equivalent experience level, and requires rudimentary music reading skills.

Student Learning Outcomes (from Course Outline)

- Successful students will perform songs in jazz, blues, and popular music forms applying basic jazz scale forms and chord voicings.
- Student Learning Outcome: Successful students will demonstrate appropriate technique for performing both lead and accompaniment.

Ron's Course Objectives: This class is a refinement of skills introduced in Acoustic Guitar, as well as an introduction into several new styles and concepts, focusing on

- Moveable chord forms: barre, fifth and sixth string root major, minor, various 7th chords and other extended harmonies
- rhythm/strum patterns for various popular guitar styles such as blues, bossa nova, New Age, calypso, reggae, etc.
- note reading in higher positions and rhythm reading studies.
- more advanced melody playing, including scales and modal improvisation
- fingerstyle arpeggio patterns
- · building a repertory of songs the best part!

Silence and put away electronic devices for each class meeting. If expecting an emergency call, notify the instructor before class. If you make or answer a call, or text during class, you will be asked to leave for the day.

• Ron does not want to see your device on the music stand or anywhere else. It is not needed during our class time. Repeat offenders will be asked to leave the room for the day.

This is an accellerated course of study; complete immersion in materials is required.

Attendance: Attendance at **all class meetings** is required and attendance will be taken at each meeting.

- Absences and tardies will be unfavorably reflected in your participation/preparation grade.
- Exceptions will be made for severe illness, emergencies, religious obligation and legal duties--with documentation.
 - Please communicate *significant* attendance problems with the instructor
 - Do not call the Creative Arts office to report absences
 - To keep up with assignments in the event of a missed class, check online class schedule, confer with classmates
- Instructors cannot drop students after the drop deadline; if you stop attending close to that deadline, and do not drop, you will receive an "F" in the course. Students are ultimately responsible for dropping courses, but may be dropped for excessive absence.
- <u>Late arrivals are extremely disruptive</u> and mess up Mr. Dunn's *chi* energy. Be on time for each class and remain in class for the entire meeting time. Chronic tardiness, or early departures will negatively impact participation score.

Requirements:

- Practice/Homework: at least one hour, daily, conscientious practice.
- Reading/practice/written homework assignments will be given. This will be a fun class, but you'll need to keep up with the work or it can be...um... uncomfortable.

Tests and Final Exam: A mid-term and final exam, plus weekly in-class evaluations. Exams test conceptual knowledge (written) and your practice of the course materials.

Test makeup: If you are absent on any test day, it is up to *you* to initiate a makeup test. **Only one test can be made up**, and must be done **within one week**. Any test not made up will constitute a **zero** for that exam.

Extra Credit can be earned by attending **up to two** live performances of: guitar–classical, flamenco, or acoustic; chamber music or symphony concerts; especially, De Anza student performances. Generally these will be worth 4 points each. **A short summary and proof of attendance is required**. Extra Credit can be used only for those with a grade of C or better.

Academic integrity: Don't cheat on, or share, written tests; you will fail that test.. Ron reports breaches of academic integrity to the Student Affairs office.
