Butterfly IV insertion:

- 1. Set-up all equipment (hearts pumping, flush syringe full, tape cut, tourniquet out, gauze and alcohol ready, butterfly)
- 2. Glove
- 3. Check the needle for barbs etc. Loosen the cap on end of tubing.
- 4. Put on tourniquet (4-6 " above insertion site)
- 5. Palpate vein
- 6. Alcohol towards the heart
- 7. Apply counter-traction with non-dominant hand
- 8. Anchor the dominant hand
- 9. Angle needle at 30 degrees and insert ("poke coming")
- 10. Stop to look for flash
- 11. Insert a 'titch' further
- 12. Lower needle and insert the rest of the way
- 13. Put a piece of tape across the wings
- 14. Back flow the blood to get rid of air in tubing
- 15. Take off tourniquet
- 16. Pinch the butterfly tubing and attach to flush
- 17. Flush
- 18. Finish taping with an 'H'
- 19. Clean up space

Over-the-catheter IV insertion:

- 1. Set-up all equipment (hearts pumping, flush syringe full, tape cut, tourniquet out, gauze and alcohol ready, over-the-needle catheter)
- 2. Glove
- 3. Check the needle for barbs, etc. Loosen the cap.
- 4. Put on tourniquet (4-6 " above insertion site)
- 5. Palpate vein
- 6. Alcohol towards the heart
- 7. Apply counter-traction with non-dominant hand
- 8. Anchor the dominant hand
- 9. Angle needle at 30 degrees and insert ("poke coming")
- 10. Stop to look for flash
- 11. Insert a 'titch' further
- 12. Lower needle and insert the rest of the way (using the 'lip')
- 13. Three blood flow stoppers: take off tourniquet, leave the needle in, and use the 4-1&2 hold on the catheter
- 14. Pick up flush tubing and remove cap.
- 15. "One out and one in"...attach flush to catheter
- 16. Flush
- 17. Make sure the 'lip' is on the top of the catheter
- 18. Dry any blood
- 19. Pick up tape with fingers 2 and 4
- 20. Lift catheter and slide tape under. Lower catheter
- 21. Secure using a chevron (cross-over approach). Make sure the tape is touching the catheter on both sides, and isn't touching the insertion site
- 22. Clean up work space.
