COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course offers a broad introduction to the nature, mediums, techniques, and various elements of the visual arts. First, we will start with the "big questions": "What is the purpose of art?" and "What is art?" Then we will cover basic terms such as abstract and representational art, style and context, as well as the relationship between form and content in works of art. Next, students will gain knowledge of the visual elements, such as color and space, as well as the principles of design. In the last part of the course we will cover various mediums, techniques, and materials.

Part I - Group discussions and answering the discussion question.

Part II - Each student submits the answer to that same question individually on Turitin.com.

Group members should not submit exactly the same answers as they will be marked as plagiarized.

Each student must participate at least once in the group discussion by Wednesday each week, or lose the group discussion points for that week. Student who missed Part I can still do Part II.
