GENERAL PLAN

STUDY EACH WEEK'S ASSIGNMENTS

Work on the lessons in the following order:

- b. Read the texts' assignment.
- c. Complete the assigned review manual assignments and turn them in **at the beginning of class.**
- d. Practice the skills learned in class (instruments will be kept in the Life Sciences Lab in the new Science Building for the duration of the quarter starting the forth week of classes.).

Test Folders

Your graded tests will be kept in individual folders; I will bring them to each class period for you to review (please do not take them out of the classroom). Please make sure that all tests stay in your folder as I do not record your grades until the end of the quarter. You will not receive your tests back at the end of the quarter.

HOMEWORK

Completed homework is **due on the assigned date**. If you are absent full credit will be given upon your return **if homework is complete**, otherwise no credit is issued.

ATTENDANCE
