Registered Nursing Terminal Objectives

Upon completion of the program, the graduate will:

- 1. Synthesize and demonstrate application of a knowledge base from natural and behavioral sciences when providing safe nursing care to clients throughout the life span.
- 2. Utilize the nursing process as the framework for providing individualized nursing care to clients in a variety of health care settings.
 - Collect comprehensive information about the self-care requisites and self-care deficits of the client.
 - 2. Analyze data to identify self-care deficits and formulate appropriate nursing diagnoses.
 - 3. Formulate with the client a nursing care plan based on self-care deficits.
 - 4. Implement the plan using skills and actions appropriate to the levels of intervention in: a wholly compensatory system, a partly compensatory system, or a supportive-educative system.
 - 5. Evaluate with the client and health team members the effectiveness of the nursing care plan.
 - Modify the nursing care plan to meet the client's changing self-care requisites and selfcare deficits.
- 3. Formulate and implement a teaching plan.
- 4. Establish collegial relationships and initiate plan for collaboration with interdisciplinary health team members.
- 5. Demonstrate therapeutic verbal, written, and group process communication skills.
- 6. Demonstrate beginning management skills including delegating and supervising other health team members to facilitate continuity of safe, effective care based on the legal scopes of practice.
- 7. Act as advocate for client's rights in health care for an increasingly culturally diverse population.
- 8. Assume responsibility for professional and personal growth.
