Sheila confirmed that an AB705 Presentation could be scheduled for the first Counselor In-Service on October 3rd. Discipline faculty representatives and assessment would be invited to share the updates. The group confirmed the shortened message that would go out to counselors that would be returning in August.

Jerry requested that the message about the math proficiency requirement (Math 114 or higher) for local degrees be clarified. Veronica said that our current process for meeting math proficiency for local degrees can be by passing Math 114 or higher with a C or better or by placement test. Casie would follow up with Evaluations and Articulation for next steps. Casie also noted that any new assessment codes were currently not built into our third party applications (Dashboard, Edunav, Degreeworks, etc.). The new codes would need to be entered in by ETS so that any course placements corresponding with the new codes would be reflected in the applications.

Casie confirmed that students would receive priority registration for the assessment requirement when a student was assessment in math and English or ESL. This would occur when a student's high school transcript assessment placement was uploaded and/or when a student test result was posted. It was noted that while any student could now register for Math 10, 11, 44, 46 or below, that they would still need Assessment to enter math placement in on Banner so that the student would meet the math assessment criteria for priority registration.

Casie and Mallory reviewed the process for assigning high school transcript assessment placements by upload. Each Thursday, Mallory pulled a list of any new fall applicants (since the last upload); and if those student that has U.S. high school transcript data on file, they received the appropriate math and English placement. Students with a high school transcript placement had the option to take the placement test to earn a higher placement. For those students that did not have U.S. high school transcripts on file, they had the opportunity to submit a transcript via the Student Assessment Form (http://www.deanza.edu/assessment/documents/da-hst-form.pdf) or take the placement test. It was noted that all students who did not already have an assessment or coursework from last academic year had been included in an upload already.

Casie showed the group of what students saw on MyPortal's 'View My Placement Results; (screen shots following) and requested feedback. Any change requests could then be made to ETS.

Roseanne shared that Kim would be the English Department chair in fall quarter. Roseanne then presented the Language Arts AB705 Implementation Timeline document.

Casie shared that the Foothill and De Anza International Student Offices met to review AB705 impacts on the F-1 Visa population, messaging for students that were not included in AB705 changes, and other assessment measures that could be adopted by the college (SAT, TOEFL, etc.).

Lastly, Casie shared that the first ESL recommendations were published by the CCCCO; and that any ESL changes would impact the English and Reading Departments.
