Within a few days, a complete draft of the Accreditation Self Study will be shared with shared governance groups, including your Academic Senate Executive Committee. The final approval of the document will occur at the last College Council meeting of the year, on the 23rd of June, finals week. Then, the Board of Trustees will approve it in July. The next major step, as most of you know, is the visit, from the 24th through the 27th of October, of the site team, led by Raúl Rodriguez, Chancellor of Rancho Santiago Community College District.
