5	Food, Housing, Transportation Survey Result ( <i>Presented by O. Sabawi and E. Flores</i> )  The Food, Housing, and Transportation Security Survey was designed to assess basic needs insecurities among De Anza's student population during the spring quarter of 2018. There were 2,021 correspondents, 11% rate of student participation.  Results reflected the following basic needs insecurities:	2:45	I/D	Flores, Sabawi/All
	- 60% transportation insecurity, 58% food insecurity, 56% housing insecurity, and 18% homeless To access the survey results visit the Food, Housing, Transportation Survey. The Emergency Food Assistance Program (EFAP, Food Pantry) (Presented by E. Flores) on campus was established with the collaboration of West Valley Community Services and the Second Food Bank to address and alleviate the food insecurity for students who qualify for assistance. Some of the draw backs of services have been the elimination of the Peanut Butter and Jelly station and a dedicated staff to help manage the program. 	<ul> <li>Eliminate 2 management positions - the AVPSS and Dean of Counseling, savings would reflect in the amount of \$382,912. This cost savings would be allocated to save 2 counselors positions (cost \$274,026) and 1 classified position A&amp; R position (cost \$108,886). Total eliminated positions: 10 faculty, 11.5 classified, 2 managers.</li> </ul>			
	<ul> <li>The targeted amended budget reductions in Student Services are \$3,207,000</li> <li>The SSPBT is scheduled to meet on October 11<sup>th</sup> to cast their vote on whether the two administrative eliminations move forward to the College Council. In preparation for the meeting, M. Booye asked the Classified Senate to come together and determine how to vote. Several Senators determine there is insufficient evidence to determine there would be a cost saving in terminating the administrators and to support this decision. It was clear that most Senators need information to make a sound decision, therefore, it was agreed the vote be casted as abstinence.</li> </ul>
