II. Enrollment Update

LaManque reviewed the handout Segmentation Analysis for Resident Student Persistence from Winter 2007 to Spring 2007 (not including FI, Job Corps, K-12 and Life Long Learning Students). The Segmentation Analysis Defines Unique Groups of Students for Comparison – A Student is included in Only One Group. Fulltime students persistence rate was the highest at 94%. The numbers indicate more incoming students from East and South San Jose, where population growth is happening. Also included was a map showing continuing student HC Enrollment by zip code 2007W to 2008W Census. Anyone wishing further data contact LaManque.

III. Budget Update

Hawk reviewed the handout of college's budget projections based on enrollment from 05-06. The college is working to get back to the figures indicated by the end this year, which would put us 1.36% over.

Hawk also reviewed the State Budget Multiyear Projections from 07-08 thru 10/11. It appears that the district will have an ending fund balance to cover the 07/08 and 08/09 years but the 09/10/11 will be a challenge.

V. Measure C
