- I. Growth FTEF for Manufacturing and Computer Numerical Control Technologies (MCNC): The IPBT voted to endorse a request for an FTEF for Manufacturing and Computer Numerical Control Technologies (MCNC) to forward to College Council on June 22. (Refer for memo addressed to IPBT from Judy Miner and Paul Setziol—dated June 19, 2006—Re: *Agenda for June 20, 2006.*)

- II. Measure C Facilities Priorities: After some discussion on this topic, the IPBT approved endorsing the prioritized list of Measure C Facilities, Version 2—6/19/06—including the “Completion of Renovation of PE13” amendment--and to forward it to College Council on June 22. (Refer for handout titled, *DAC Office of Instruction, Measure C, Facilities Priorities, Version 2, 6/19/06* and the memo addressed to Jeanine Hawk, Donna Jones-Dulin, IPBT and Instructional Deans, from Rich Schroeder, dated 6/20/06—Re: *Facilities Priorities List.*)

- III. Measure C Instructional Equipment Requests: It was noted that there are \$12 million dollars in requests from Instruction and only \$8 million available. (Refer to the handout titled, *Methodology for Allocating Instructional Equipment Amounts.*) There was a lot of discussion pertaining to page 6 of the handout titled, *Measure C Instructional Equipment Request—June 20, 2006.* Judy explained that there could be a possibility of other “pots of money” becoming available to help with the \$4 million difference between the requests and the availability of funds. She stressed the importance of having their instructional equipment requests on “the list,” because after July 15, it will be very difficult to alter the list. After a discussion, the IPBT voted to endorse the *Instructional Equipment Request List—June 20, 2006* to forward to College Council on June 22.
