### What would we look like with a 7% reduction and additional loss of two classifieds:

#### 2012-13:

Potentially one counselor serving 1700 students per quarter with 4-6 weeks waiting period for appointment Limited screening of continuing students for drop-ins and appointments and prospective student assistance Elimination of academic and probation tracking, no transfer services, no TAGs, no personal and crisis counseling Slower responses to inquiries (emails, phone, etc.)

Delayed data entries/update for admission and SEVIS

Elimination of Summer ESL program = loss of \$80,000 per summer and \$0.5 million per year since loss of this group of students matriculating

Admission of international students reduced once a year (Fall only) = loss of approx. 500 international students Reduce office hours open to the public by 15 hours per week; i.e., open 25 hrs./wk

Elimination of health insurance processing, monitoring and advising

Elimination of website, listserv and other electronic communications with continuing and prospective students Counselors manage SARS and continuing student files on their own

### What would we look like with a 7% reduction:

#### 2012-13:

Potentially one counselors serving 1700 students per quarter with 3-4 weeks waiting period for appointment Limited screening of continuing students for drop-ins and appointments and no prospective student assistance Elimination of academic and probation tracking, no transfer services, no TAGs, no personal and crisis counseling Slower responses to inquiries (emails, phone, etc.)

Delayed data entries/update for admission and SEVIS

No extension of international student application deadlines, decline of international enrollment by 10% Reduce office hours to the public by10 hours per week; i.e., open 30 hrs/wk

Counselors manage SARS and continuing student files on their own

#### 2013-14:

All of above impacts for 2012-13

Elimination of Spring admissions. Limited to Fall and Winter quarters only = loss of 200 students per year Reduced SEVIS, admissions, and counseling hours and services

Delayed and limited communications with prospective and continuing students

Elimination of Summer ESL Program = loss of \$80,000 per summer and \$0.5 million per year

## Institutional Responsibility for SEVIS Compliance

In order to enroll non-immigrant F visa category students at an institution, the institution is required by the Department of Homeland Security to update and maintain the records of all F visa students according to federal law and regulations in the Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS). De Anza College, via the International Student Programs office, is required to monitor and to report students from their "Initial" to "Complete" statuses at this institution. (*See table*) **Failure** to comply with the record-keeping and reporting requirements can lead to withdrawal of certification, or denial of recertification.

To comply with increasingly complex SEVIS regulations and with the participation of SEVIS II in 2012, it has been difficult to sustain our current F-1 student population with our current staffing at ISP. Certain SEVIS functions had to be withdrawn in recent years. Any further elimination of SEVIS monitoring, data management and document processing given reduction in ISP staffing will potentially jeopardize De Anza's certification and ability to enroll F visa international students.

<b>Initial student reporting without Port-of-Entry (POE) data:</b> If an <i>initial</i> student record did not appear in the <i>Alert for Students in Initial Status with Port of Entry Records</i> or there is no POE information, update the record to indicate whether or not the student arrived and enrolled in classes.	Within 30 days of the Program Start Date the student record must be registered or cancelled
<b>Active student reporting for each term or semester:</b> Each new session, report whether or not an <i>active</i> student reported and enrolled in classes.	Within 30 days of the Next Session Start Date, <i>register</i> the student record or <i>terminate</i> for <i>Failure to Enroll</i> .
<b>Draft student records for F-1 transfer students:</b> After the Record Release Date for an F-1 student transferring to your school, update the <i>draft transfer-in</i> record to <i>initial</i> status by submitting the student's information.	Update the <i>draft</i> record to <i>initial</i> status after the Record Release Date, but prior to the Program Start Date.
<b>Initial records for F-1 transfer students:</b> F-1 students transferring into a new school must report to you within 15 days of the Program Start Date. They may report earlier. Update the student's record in SEVIS to indicate whether or not the student arrived and enrolled in classes.	Register or terminate the student record for Transfer Student No Show within 30 days of the Program Start Date.
Reporting nonimmigrants changing to F-1 status: All nonimmigrants changing to F-1 status must report to a DSO once the change has been approved. Update the student's <i>initial</i> record in SEVIS to indicate whether or not the student arrived and enrolled in classes.	Register or terminate the student record for no show within 30 days of the Program Start Date.
Note: If a Change of Status is still pending as of the anticipated Program Start Date, you will need to defer attendance until the next earliest possible Program Start Date.	
Reporting a student's graduation and program completion: Report a student's graduation or successful completion of the program by maintaining an accurate Program End Date.	Update the <i>active</i> student's Program End Date within 30 days.
General F-1 record reporting requirements: Report any change in a student's personal information or academic status including (but not limited to) disciplinary action by the school resulting from a criminal conviction, change of address, change of the student's or dependant's name, or early graduation.	Make changes within 21 days.
