Am I eligible to join the IMPACT AAPI program?

- IMPACT AAPI targets students have taken the <u>De Anza English and Math Placement</u>

 <u>Tests</u> and their test results were **at least one** of the following...
 - o English Placement:
 - 2 Levels below college-level English
 - o English Placement AND Math Placement:
 - 1 level below college-level reading & 3 levels below college-level math
 - O Math Placement:
 - 2 levels below college-level Math (Math/MPS 212)

What are IMPACT AAPI Curricular Pathways?

- IMPACT AAPI <u>Curricular Pathways</u> are...
 - o 3 different Learning Community Sequences to improve transfer pathways
 - Once placed into a Learning Community, students will continue through the pathway's courses with the same students
- These 3 Learning Community Sequences are...
 - o Readiness and Success in College-Level English (LinC)
 - LinC is for students who took the <u>De Anza English Placement Test</u>,
 and placed 2 Levels below college-level English
 - Checkout LinC courses information!
 - o Readiness and Success in College-Level Math and English (CREM)

- CREM is for students who took the <u>De Anza English & Math Placement</u>
 Test, and placed 2 Levels below college-level English
- Checkout <u>CREMcourses</u> information!
- Strategies for Preparation in STEM (MPS)
 - MPS is CREM is for students who took the <u>De Anza Math Placement</u>
 Test and placed 2 Levels below college-level Math (Math/MPS 212)
 - Checkout STEMcourses information!
