PLEASE READ CAREFULLY					
You Must:					
1)	Register as a full-time student and remain <i>in-status</i> for the duration of studies (9 months per year). <i>In-status</i> means completing 12 or more units per quarter (with a De Anza requirement of a minimum of 2.00 Grade Point Average).				
2)	Pay required tuition and fees prior to the deadline set by De Anza.				
3)	Comply with the mandatory health insurance requirements.				
4)	Report changes in: name, address, phone number, social security number, visa status, academic major or financial support to the International Student Programs within 5 days. Notify the International Student Programs if you voluntarily terminate attendance at De Anza College or transfer to another school.				
5)	Have the I-20 Document properly endorsed every time you travel outside the United States. <u>Bring the I-20 and passport to the International Student Programs at least 4 weeks prior to departure for a signature endorsement.</u>				
6)	Have the International Student Advisor authorize all employment (on- or off- campus) and practical training.				
7)	Keep passport valid up to six months in future.				
8)	Understand the Academic Integrity policies of De Anza College regarding cheating, plagiarism, etc.				
9)	Enroll in courses agreed upon by the International Student Advisor/Counselor and me.				
10)	Add or drop classes only with the approval of the International Student Advisor and/or Counselor.				
11)	Concurrent Enrollment: Obtain written permission from the International Student Advisor/Counselor prior to registering courses at another institution while in status at De Anza College.				
12)	Meet quarterly with the International Student Counselor for academic and personal guidance.
