Data for first-time (no previous higher education experience) students at De Anza College in the fall quarters for the last five to seven years was summarized in six tables, which include the following:

### Highlights for this data analysis include:

- In terms of actual enrollment and percentage change/growth, Fremont Union High and East Side Union High school districts were the top feeder schools districts for De Anza College during the last five fall terms. However, these schools began to show a decline in enrollment for first-timers at De Anza College in fall 2009, when compared with their respective peak figures in fall 2008. (See Table 1.)
- Although first-time male students still outnumber females, females have shown the largest percentage growth in these past five years (32% compared to 22%). (See Table 2.)
- For high school districts with a first-time student head count at De Anza College of at least 300 in fall 2009, there have been significant growth (16% to 40%) for the targeted populations of Hispanics and Filipinos (in particular, for Campbell Union High and East Side Union High), but little or negative growth for Black or African American students (in particularly, Fremont Union High with a -43% growth). (See Table 3.)

- East Side Union High was the high school district with the largest share of first-time students at De Anza College in the last five fall quarters; however, 90% of the students from this school district who took the English placement test scored at a basic skills level. (See Table 4.)
- For all feeder high school districts, excluding Gilroy Unified, first-time female students at De Anza College from fall 2003 to fall 2007 transferred to a four-college at a higher rate than first-time male students. (See Table 5.)
- First-time students at De Anza College from fall 2003 to fall 2007 from feeder high schools of Asian and White ethnic backgrounds tend to show the highest rate of transfer to four-year colleges (45% and 24%, respectively). Private feeder high schools showed the highest rates for transfers. Among public schools, Saratoga High, Leland High, and Lynbrook were among top schools for transfer rates; however, only Leland High showed a significant count for one of the target groups at De Anza, Hispanics, who scored only four percentage points below the school's transfer rate for first-time student De Anza College students.
