Subject: Student Time to Degree and Student Transfers

The General Education Review Committee posed two questions:

1. How many students that receive an associate's degree also transfer?

2. How long, on average, does it take a student to obtain an associate's degree?

Highlights include:

- 58% of students who receive a degree transferred to a 4-year institution.
- Of students who received a degree in 2012-13, the average number of years to obtain a degree was 4.72 years.

Student Transfers

Students who were awarded an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree between 2010-11 and 2012-13 were tracked using the National Student Clearinghouse database to determine their enrollment at a four-year institution.

Note: 4,000 degrees were awarded over the time period. The numbers above represent unique students receiving a degree and tracked to the Clearinghouse.

- 93% of students who received a degree were found in the Clearinghouse.
- Of the 3,420 students found in the database, 62% were found at a 4-year institution.
