A survey of LinC program students was conducted at the end of the Fall quarter in 2015. The survey was distributed to all students enrolled in a LinC course which resulted in 154 valid respondents. All sections of the LinC program were given the opportunity to participate in the survey.

The sections that have chosen to participate include:

Important Highlights Include:

- 16% of respondents reported that they found out about the learning community by their teachers, 21% found it out in the online schedule of the classes, 29% by a counselor, 21% by a friend, and 1% on a flyer. The last 6% of respondents reported that the course title or topic interested them.(1)
- 86% of respondents stated they worked with classmates during class “very often” or “often.”
- 84% of respondents described the quality of their relationship with teachers in this learning community is “very friendly, supportive and helpful” or “friendly, supportive and helpful.”
- 79% of respondents described the quality of their relationship with classmates in this learning community as “very friendly, supportive and helpful” or “friendly, supportive and helpful.”
- 64% of respondents described their overall educational experience in this learning community as “Excellent” or “very good.”
- 94% of respondents reported they would recommend this learning community to a friend or family member.

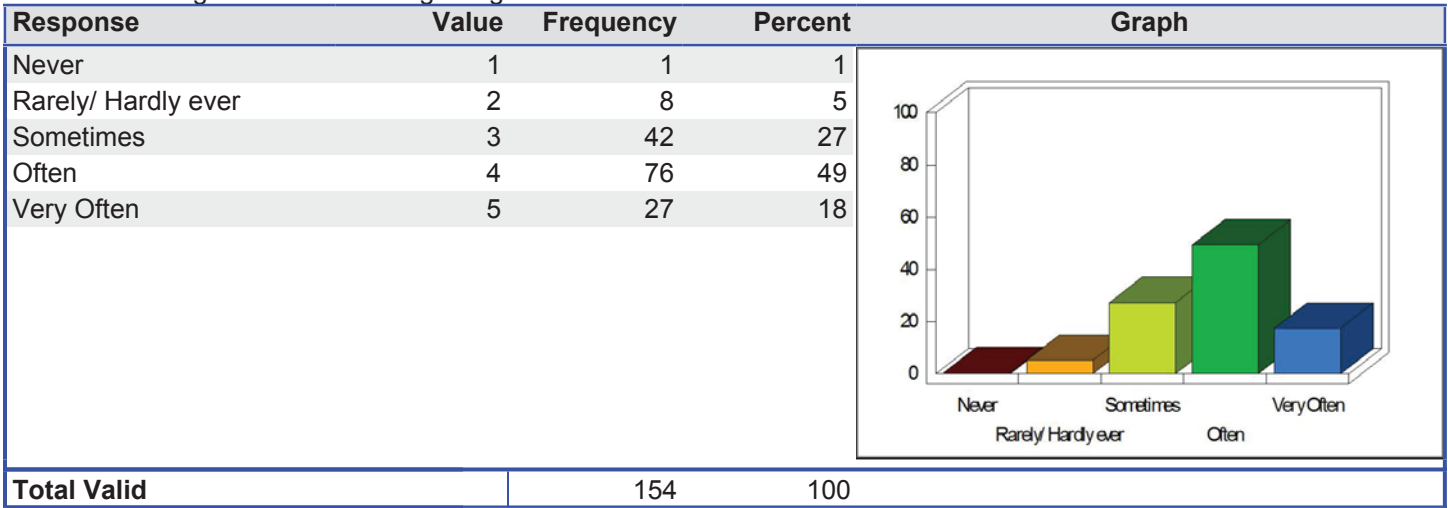
