- Filipino students had a success rate of 70% with a withdrawal/non retention and non success rate of 15%.
- Latino students exhibited a success rate of 69% with a non success rate of 19% and a withdrawal/non retention rate of 12%.
- African American students also exhibited a success rate of 69%, a non success rate of 8% and withdrawal/nonretention rate of 23%, the highest rate of withdrawals for any group.
