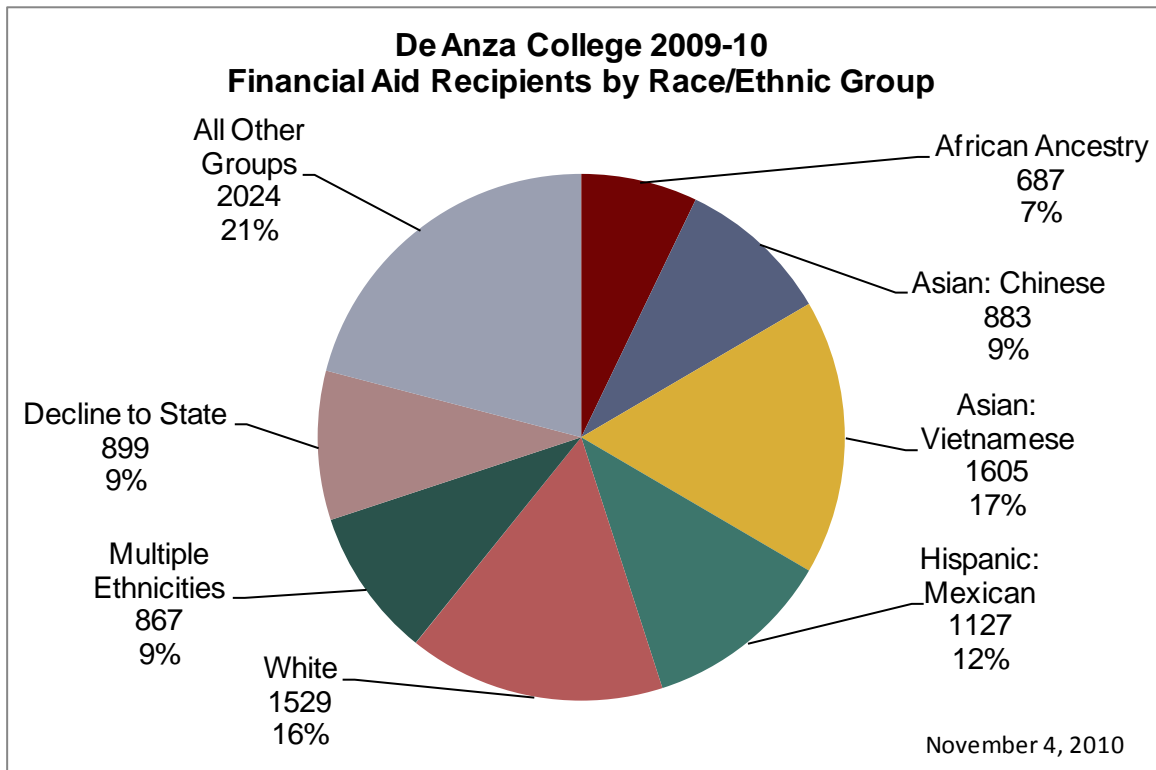


De Anza College Student Financial Aid Trends, Year End 2009 and 2010  
 November 4, 2010, Andrew LaManque, FHDA Institutional Research  
 (Note: A section on methodology follows this page)

- The unduplicated number of students receiving aid is up 1,612 students or 19% from 8,463 in 2009 to 10,075 in 2010.
- Pell Grant recipients are up 26% from 2009 to 2010 (2,960 to 3,737).
- BOG recipients are up 21% from 2009 to 2010 (8,082 to 9,751).
- About 2/3rds of financial aid students indicated degree or transfer as their initial goal.
- 57% of Vietnamese students received some type of aid, compared with 20% for White, 39% for Mexican American, and 59% for African American students.
- Vietnamese students represented 17% of all financial aid recipients compared with 9% of all enrolled students during the year (see Figure 1 below).

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## Methodology

Year end financial aid extracts from the SIS / RMS system is merged with data from the Research Data Warehouse. The data warehouse contains demographic variables for students based on the student application. Data from the most recent application is used in this report. 200-300 students each year are found in the RMS extract but not the data warehouse (for various reasons). Thus the demographic counts do not always equal the year end figures from RMS.

A “financial aid student” is defined as a student receiving any type of financial aid over the course of the fiscal year, including scholarships, loans, and grants.
