De Anza College fiscal year FTES estimates show a decline in resident FTES of about 1% in 2006-07. Bernata Slater, Director of Budget Operations for the District has confirmed on July 18, 2007 that the District fell below its base apportionment FTES. While held harmless financially for one year, the District will need to increase FTES by 1% in 2007-08. Summer and Fall projections for De Anza suggest local student enrollment will need to increase significantly more than 1% to attain this goal.
