Subject: Foster Youth Students at De Anza College

De Anza College currently collects information on foster youth students from two sources, the CCCApply application and the Banner cohorts table.

The current CCCApply question asks the following voluntary question:

Are you now, or have you ever been, a dependent or ward of the state through California's child welfare system? (Yes, No)

Of students enrolled in spring 2012 who applied within the previous year, 100 students answered yes to this question.

The following question will be added to the CCCApply application this month as a mandatory question which will enable us to gather more informative data on foster youth at our college:

Are you a foster youth?

- 0 I have never been in Foster Care.
- 1 I am currently in Foster Care in California.
- 2 I was previously in Foster Care in California, and aged out or emancipated from the system.
- 3 I am currently in Foster Care in a system outside California.
- 4 I was previously in Foster Care in a system outside California, and aged out or emancipated from the system.
- 5 I was temporarily in Foster Care, but did not age out or emancipate from the system.

Within the Banner system, there is a place to track foster youth students within the cohort table. In 2012 spring, 35 students were flagged as enrolled in the De Anza Foster Youth Program.

The following tables provide additional information on the 100 students who answered yes to the voluntary question on the CCCApply application. Of the 100 students, two were identified in the cohort table in Banner as enrolled in the Foster Youth Program in spring 2012.
