The Political Science Engagement Survey was given at the beginning of Spring quarter, 2014, and again at the end of the quarter. Students who took both pre and post surveys resulted in 217 respondents.

#### Highlights:

- 34% of respondents in the Pre-survey correctly answered Tuesday for which day of the week local, state and federal elections are held on compared to 73% of respondents who answered Tuesday in the Post-survey.
- 75% of respondents in the Pre-survey Strongly agree or Agree to "finding it easy to understand people from other cultures" opposed to 81% of respondents in the Post-survey.
- 60% of Pre-survey respondents Strongly Agree or Agree that they "can communicate well with someone whose views and opinions are different than his/her own" compared to 75% of Post-survey respondents.
- 67% of Pre-survey respondents and 77% of Post survey respondents Strongly Agree or Agree that "Corporations and the wealthy have too much influence in our country and need to be reigned in".
