
Observations on International Students (F1 and FZ Visa Codes – referred to below as "F1" students)

Draft, August 5, 2004

- ➤ F1 students make up about 75% of the tuition derived from nonresident students.
- ➤ F1 students generated nearly 9 million dollars in nonresident tuition revenue for the district in 2003-04.
- ➤ F1 students represented nearly 7% of the total FTES at the district in 2003-04.
- ➤ The total number of FHDA F1 students reported as of the fall quarter census increased 42% from fall 1999 to fall 2003, from 1,337 to 1,892.
- ➤ F1 students attend full time at a higher rate than resident students. From fall 1999 through fall 2003, the percent of full time students at census ranged from 84% to 90% for F1 students compared with 31% to 36% for residents.
- ➤ F1 students persist at a higher rate than resident students, more than 60% of F1 students attending fulltime in the fall of 2003 maintained a fulltime status in winter 2004 and spring 2004, compared to less than 40% of resident students.
- The countries from which the most F1 students come from are China, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, and Taiwan.
 - For De Anza College, Canada, India, Malaysia, Pakistan, Philippines, Singapore, Sweden, Thailand, United Kingdom, and Vietnam are also among the largest contributors.
 - For Foothill College, Brazil, Canada, France, Germany (in fall 2003), India, Macau, Malaysia, Poland, Singapore, Sweden, and the United Kingdom are also large contributors.
- Course success rates are higher for F1 students than resident students. In 2003-04 the success rate for F1 students at both De Anza and Foothill was 88%, compared with a resident success rate at De Anza of 77% and 84% at Foothill.






Methodology: Visa status group derived from RDB Census Student Extract by Term. Students with a not null Visa Code are included. Note, it is possible for students to have more than one visa code over the four quarters. The resulting file is merged with the student billing file for the subcode 13001 - NonResident Tuition. Charges are summed over the four quarters for the one subcode. Students with charges totaling '0' are not included. The result of this merge is then merged with the Enrollment Registration file from the DW where enrollment status = 'E' to derive the FTES estimate. In this analysis, out of state nonresidents are students with no visa code but with a billing subcode of 13001.






