## Drop for NonPayment

### Spring 2009 Statistics

- There were a total of 2,892 enrollments that were dropped for nonpayment.
- 1,248 class sections had one or more students dropped for nonpayment.
- On average there was 2.3 drop for nonpayment enrollments for each of the 1,248 sections with a drop for nonpayment.
- 1,152 students had one or more drop for nonpayment enrollments.
- Of the 1,152 students that had a drop for nonpayment, 910 or 79% ended up enrolling in at least one section for the spring quarter.
- Of the 1,152 students that had a drop for nonpayment, 591 or 51% ended up enrolling in the same section.
- Of the 1,152 students that had a drop for nonpayment, 242 or 21% ended up with no enrollment for the spring quarter.

# Winter 2007 Comparison

#### Email on 2/5/2007

For the winter 2007 term we had about 3,500 sections / seats dropped for non-payment. About 1,300 students had at least one class dropped for nonpayment. About 75% of the 1300 students --1,000 were enrolled in at least one section as of census. 300 students did not re-enroll after being dropped for non-payment. These figures are about 1/2 the totals for previous quarters that I have reviewed. The re-enroll rate of 75% is slightly higher than previous terms that ranged from 60-70%.
