SUBJECT: Winter 2004 Scheduling and Registration System Report (SARS)

Please find attached information from the SARS database. The data is a count of the number of students in each location that had at least one appointment during the period 1/5/04 through 4/2/04. It only includes students with an active appointment with a counselor listed during the appointment. It is possible that a student will see a counselor in more that one location during a quarter so that any aggregation across locations should be considered duplicative.

Observations (based on a comparison to Winter 2004 Census Demographics)

- ➤ Each location sees slightly more women than are found in the overall De Anza College population (upper 50% versus lower 50%).
- ➤ For EOPS the highest percentage of students with appointments currently reside in the east San Jose zip codes beginning with 951 (68%).
- About 34% of counseling appointments were from students that identified themselves as Asian, this figure is similar to the overall college percentage.
- Across all locations, students selecting "undecided" and "seeking to obtain an associate degree and transfer" as the initial education goal represented more than half of the students with appointments.
- ➤ 45% of the students seen by international counselors had passed the GED, this compares with 7% for the overall campus population.
