

Subject: Data for Honors Students

Analysis of the Honors Program

In 2020-21, 46% of students enrolled in Honors courses identify as Asian though Asian students comprise 42% of the student population, showing an overrepresentation of Asian students in the Honors program by 4 percentage points. Overrepresentation is also present for white students by 7 percentage points. Underrepresentation is present for African American (-2 % pts), Latinx (-10 % pts) and Filipinx (-2 % pts) students. For example, 16% of students enrolled in Honors courses identify as Latinx while making up 26% of the student population, resulting in underrepresentation by 10 percentage points.
