Subject: LGBTQI Student Population

This report provides a preliminary look at the LGBTQI student population at De Anza between fall of 2014 and spring of 2017. This analysis is based on self-reported sexual orientation data collected from CCCApply.

LGBTQI Students

The LGBTQI student population consistently ranged between 2% and 3% of the total student population every quarter during the past three academic years (between 467 and 780 students per quarter).

The majority of LGBTQI students identified as female every quarter during the past three academic years. The rates for female LGBTQI students ranged between 68% (497) and 54% (292) of total LGBTQI students.

LGBTQI Groups

- During the 2014-15 academic year, the majority of LGBTQI students (40% to 41%) identified as homosexual (gay or lesbian), followed by bisexual (30% to 35%), other sexual orientations (17% to 18%), and transgender (8% to 10%).
- During the 2015-16 academic year, the majority of LGBTQI students (34% to 37%) identified as bisexual, followed by homosexual (31% to 33%), other sexual orientations (14% to 17%), and transgender (15% to 18%).
- During the 2016-17 academic year, the majority of LGBTQI students (36% to 37%) identified as bisexual, followed by homosexual (29% to 32%), transgender (18% to 21%), and other sexual orientations (12% to 14%).

The majority of LGBTQI students in all academic quarters identified as Latino/a (32% to 37%), followed by Asian (22% to 29%), and White (21% to 25%). Other ethnicities were cited at rates between 0% and 9%.
