# About the Survey


The CCSSE is administered in the spring quarter to credit students and gathers information about their overall college experience. De Anza College previously participated in 2007 and 2009.

The survey focuses on educational practices and student behaviors associated with higher levels of learning, persistence and completion.

All faculty members teaching in the spring were included in a pool from which a random sample of course sections were chosen to administer the survey. This resulted in 1,236 valid responses.


#### Student Responses

How would you evaluate your entire educational experience at De Anza?




The majority (52%) of students stated that they had a good experience while onethird (33%) stated they had an excellent experience.

# How much does De Anza encourage you to spend significant amounts of time studying?




One-third (34%) of students stated they are very much encouraged to spend time studying while 40% stated they are encouraged quite a bit.

About 40% of respondents stated that De Anza provided quite a bit of support to help them be successful while 29% stated they received very much support.






### How important are the following services to you at this college?




• Over 79% of respondents felt that academic advising, career counseling, tutoring, skill labs and transfer credit assistance are important to them.



• 41% of respondents plan to or have taken a study skills course, up from 40% in 2009, while 55% of respondents plan/have taken an orientation course (49% in 2009).

• 53% of respondents stated that De Anza quite a bit or very much contributed to them developing clearer career goals, down from 54% in 2009.





## Gender of Respondents




The distribution by gender was equal to our total student population.

#### **Ethnicity of Respondents**




The respondents comprised a higher rate of Asian students (33% vs. 38%) and a smaller percent of White students (18% vs. 26%) than the total student population. International students comprised a higher percent of the respondents than the student population (21% vs. 10%).

#### Age of Respondents



The age of survey respondents was representative of our student population with the exception of students aged 20-21 which was higher than our student population (30% vs. 20%).

#### **Enrollment Status of Respondents**



The respondents were comprised of a smaller percent of part-time students (28% vs. 56%) than the total student population and a higher percent of full-time students (72% vs. 44%).
