Subject: High School Participation Rates

This analysis provides a brief overview of the high school districts within Santa Clara County and the number of students from each district who enrolled at De Anza in the fall term. Not all schools are listed, just those that represent the greatest loss or gain in enrollment from year to year. Highlights include:

Loss in Enrollment:

- Overall, the number of graduates from a <u>Santa Clara County Public High School</u> remained stable from 2015 to 2016, however, the number of students who attended De Anza in the fall decreased by 424 students, or by 17%.
- The number of students from the <u>Campbell High School District</u> who enrolled at De Anza decreased from 275 to 239 or by 13% while the number of graduates increased by 2%.
- The number of students from the <u>East Side Union High School District</u> who enrolled at De Anza decreased from 1,000 to 687 or by 31% while the total number of graduates decreased by 3%.
 - o The greatest loss in enrollment was from Independence High (-45% change), Mount Pleasant (-42% change), and Silver Creek (-41% change).
- The number of students from the <u>Fremont Union High School District</u> who enrolled at De Anza decreased from 467 to 378 or by 17% while the number of graduates decreased by 3%.

Gain in Enrollment

- The <u>San Jose High School District</u> saw an increase of 5% for the number of students who enrolled at De Anza in the fall, while the total percent of graduates remained flat.
 - The largest gains were from San Jose High (61% change), Leland High (50% change), Pioneer (22% change), and Willow Glen (9% change).
- The <u>Santa Clara High School District</u> also saw an overall increase in the number of students who enrolled at De Anza of 15% from 157 to 181. Graduation rates increased 11% for the district.
 - Santa Clara High School enrollment at De Anza increased 27% while Adrian Wilcox increased 3%.
