Homework

Homework is assigned each class on WebAssign and will be due by Tuesday, Friday or Sunday 11:45 pm. Submission for each question is limited to 3 attempts. Each student is allowed 3 two-day extensions by **emailing** the instructor **before due date**. (Extension requests on WebAssign will be discarded.) Each extension will apply to all the sections with the same due date. Homework grade for each section is on WebAssign. The total will be scaled to 100 points and be posted on Catalyst at quarter end.

In-Class Assignments (5 points each, Catalyst will show 20(+5) points x 4)

There will be various in-class assignments during the quarter in order to reinforce new topics and concepts. These assignments will be a mixture of both individual and group work. In-class assignments will be reviewed in class and students will take notes/make corrections to their work in red pencil or pen, (only a red pencil or pen may be out during the in-class assignment review,) and will be remitted to the instructor at the end of the period for grading. The assignments are graded based on completeness, efforts, neatness, and corrections you make. NO make-up in-class assignments will be granted. In-Class Assignment points will be totaled every five classes and then be posted on Catalyst. The maximum possible points for each 5-weeks is 25 points.

Class Participation (5 points x 4, plus extra credit of 3 points x 4)

Students are required to share their work of the in-class assignment on board during the correction time. Each student should participate at least 2 times every five weeks. After the required participation, students can earn 1 extra credit for each additional sharing up to 3 times every five classes. This will be the only extra credit for this class.

Tests (100 points each)

There will be three 1-hour tests during the quarter. All tests and exam will be closed book and no calculator will be allowed. NO make-up tests will be given. A missed test will receive a zero score. The only exception is that if you missed a test due to emergency, with supporting documentation, that one test score will be replaced by your final exam score (scaled to 100). Any other missed tests will receive zeros.

Final Exam (200 points)

A comprehensive 2-hour final exam will take place on **Monday**, **3/27** 1:45-3:45 pm. NO make-up exam will be given. You must take the final exam to pass the course.

Drop Policy

Attendance is integral to your success in this course. Per school policy, any student absent in the first week will be dropped from the class. After that, it is your responsibility to drop the class. A student who stops coming to class and does not officially withdrawal from the course will receive an 'F'. No incomplete grade will be assigned.

Academic Integrity

All students are expected to exercise high academic integrity throughout the quarter. You are encouraged to work together but simply copying down answers from another student is not only wrong, but will not contribute to your learning. Any instances of cheating or plagiarism will result in disciplinary action, which may include getting a zero on the assignment, report to the PSME dean, which may lead to dismissal from the class or the college.

Classroom conduct

- Attendance: Student attendance is vital to the success in this class. Students are expected to attend all classes, including to arrive on time and to stay for the whole class. Any student being absent will receive a zero grad for the in-class assignment of the day. Any tardiness or leaving early of 5 minutes or more will result in receiving only half of the credit for the in-class assignments.
- Electronic Devices: Cell phones should be turned off or to silent during class and put away at all times. There is a zero tolerance cell phone policy in this class. If you have a cell phone or other similar device out during class for any reason, you may be asked to leave class. Laptops or tablets are permitted only for accessing e-text. Texting is definitely not allowed during class. Cell phones are to be put away during tests and exam.
