Step 1

Apply for Admissions

- Apply online at www.cccapply.org/applications/CCCApply/apply/DeAnza_College.html
- You don't have to have a Social Security Number to apply, but if you plan on applying for Financial Aid, you will need to provide an SSN. If you are an undocumented student, you can call 864-8722 for more information about how to apply and whether you qualify for in-state fees under AB540.

Step 2

Take Placement Tests

- If you plan on earning an AA/AS degree, transfer, or want to take math, English or science classes, you will need to take a placement test.
- Placement Tests should be taken as soon as possible or at least three weeks before attending Counseling 100.
- Placement tests are offered on campus on a drop-in basis in the Student and Community Services building (SCS).
- Visit www.deanza.edu/admissions/placement for more information.
- If you have taken math, English, or science courses at another college, show your transcripts to a De Anza counselor www.deanza.edu/counseling.

Step 3

Attend College Orientation (Counseling 100)

- The Counseling 100: Orientation to College class is where you will learn everything you will need to know to accomplish your academic goal.
- The orientation will include De Anza major and degree options, General Education patterns, transfer strategies, and other important information to help you succeed.

Step 4 Register for Classes

- Register for classes online at www.deanza.edu/registration/myinfo.html
- Your date to register will be online after your application has been processed. You will receive your confirmation of enrollment and other important information via e-mail. Please make sure your email address is current.
- Choose your classes from the online schedule at www.deanza.edu/schedule or obtain a paper copy at the Bookstore.
- Registration dates are assigned by the total number of units completed at De Anza or Foothill Colleges only.

Step 5 Pay Your Fees

- You will be informed of your fees during the online registration process.
- Payment may be made online, by mail, our drop box, or in person.
- Fees are due at the time of registration.
- See www.deanza.edu/registration/cashier/policies.html for the payment policy.
- Need \$\$ for school? Go to Financial Aid (www.deanza.edu/financialaid) to see if you qualify for a fee waiver, or speak to a financial aid representative.

Step 6 Attend Classes

- Be sure to attend the first day of class. If you do not attend the first class meeting, or if you are late, the instructor may drop you.
- If you want to add classes after school starts, attend the class and get an add code if seats are still available.

Counseling 100: Orientation to College

Counseling 100 is a class designed for **NEW STUDENTS** to De Anza. Most new students take Counseling 100 in the summer, but the course is also offered in Fall, Winter, and Spring.

- The summer Counseling 100 is a 4-day session offered weekly in late July, August and September.
- Counselors teach the Counseling 100 Orientation class and will help students register for their fall classes during the orientation.
- Counseling 100 includes:
 - Programs, services, policies, degrees, certificates, transfer requirements, and college culture information.
 - Focus will be on strategies needed for academic success and the development of a one-quarter Educational Plan.
- *Take your placement test for English and Math as soon as you can or at least 3 weeks before your Orientation class.*



Explore our campus to get a feel of the environment. Do not be afraid to ask for help if you are lost.

Counseling 100 (Orientation to College) classes are:

- 0.5 unit (one-half unit)
- 4 days in the summer, or 6 weeks if taken in the Fall, Winter, or Spring quarters.

HOW To Get Started?

- New students must apply for admission to De Anza before testing.
- **Photo I.D.** required to take the placement tests; e.g., passport, driver's license (Identification must be in English.)
- Students **must have their De Anza 8 digit campuswide ID** number.
- Tests are on a drop-in basis during the posted test times.
- Bring several #2 wood pencils.
- For Calculus, Chemistry and Biology paper & pencil tests, students must report 30 minutes prior to the posted test times. Tests will begin promptly. No one will be admitted late. You must stay for the entire test time.
- Students with a learning disability or physical disability should contact the Assessment Center for alternative testing formats.
- Access your results from your student account online.
- Results:
 - English Placement test results are available within 2 weeks.
 - ESL test results may take up to 3 weeks from test date.
 - Computerized Math, Calculus, Chemistry and Biology test results are available within 2 working days following test.
- Testing results show course placements, not scores.

WHO Needs To Take The Placement Test?

All new students must take the placement test. If you are planning to:

- Earn an A.A./A.S., or want to take English, math, or science classes.
- Exceptions:
 - Obtained an AA degree or higher or
 - If you have taken and passed certain courses at another college, you must show your transcripts to a counselor.

WHY?

- Placement tests are not pass or fail, but designed to measure your skill levels for placement into the appropriate class.
- Placement tests will help you pick the right courses for you.
- The following courses require a Placement test:

For First-Time Login

1. **Open an Internet browser** and type in the following URL:
<http://myportal.fhda.edu/>
2. Enter your login information in the Secure Login area and **click the Login button**.
 - Your username will always be your campuswide ID (CWID).
 - Your initial password will be your six-digit birth date in **mmddyy** format.


