Hi students. Welcome to ESL 234/444! I am so happy that you chose this hybrid class! We will be meeting on campus on Mondays and Wednesdays and online Tuesdays and Thursdays. This class requires a lot of work and effort, but if you work hard, your English will greatly improve. Please know that I am here to help you and support you. Please ask me questions and come to my office hour for additional help. I want you to succeed and learn as much as you can over the next 12 weeks! I know that we will have a wonderful quarter together!

Course Description: In this class you will learn many new vocabulary words, improve your listening comprehension skills and reading comprehension skills, improve your speaking ability, and learn to write grammatically accurate sentences and short paragraphs. Be prepared to spend 10-15 hours per week outside of class studying and doing homework assignments.

Student Learning Outcomes

- 1. Comprehend, analyze, and respond to reading and listening low-intermediate materials.
- 2. Write a group of topic-related sentences using level-specific grammar and vocabulary.
- 3. Demonstrate understanding and usage of level-specific grammar and vocabulary in reading, writing, listening, and speaking.

Course Content

1. **Homework**: You will have homework every day! Homework will be assigned from the textbooks. You will also have writing assignments, online grammar assignments, and online listening assignments for homework.

Reading Homework

• Every week, you will read chapters from *Insights for Today* and *What Every ESL Student Should Know*. Make sure to read the texts and do the assigned exercises before class. You can write your answers in your textbook or on a separate sheet of paper or on a word document if we are working online.

Vocabulary Homework

• Each week you will have assigned vocabulary words from *Insights for Today* and *What Every ESL Student Should Know*. Complete a *Vocabulary Notebook Page* for each word. Make sure a native speaker checks your original sentences each week.

Writing Homework

• You will have several writing assignments (paragraphs and sentences) based on our grammar and readings.

Listening/Speaking Homework

- Pearson English Interactive 2 Software: You will do online exercises on PEI2. You will get add codes to use this software during the second week of class.
- Oral Presentations: You will have two in-class oral presentations during the quarter. Prepare for these at home. Practice many times. You can also get help from a tutor in the Listening and Speaking Center.

Grammar Homework

• Focus on Grammar 2 Pearson Software: You will do online exercises using FOG2. You will get add codes to use this software during the second week of class.

- Focus on Grammar 2 (textbook): You will have exercises for homework every week. Make sure to complete the exercises before class. You can write your answers in your textbook or on a separate sheet of paper or on a word document if we are working online.
- 2. Class Participation: Class participation is extremely important because it gives you the opportunity to use and practice your English skills. We will use "silence" as a learning tool in class. You will be asked to think silently about a question or grammar point for a period of time. This gives you a chance to focus and concentrate. After you have reflected silently, you will share your ideas with your classmates in pairs, and then I may call on you to share your response with the whole class.

You will also work with your classmates in pairs and small groups to discuss homework, share ideas, and practice listening and speaking. In order to participate in class, you must come to class prepared and on time.

Class Participation & Preparedness means:

- •Being in your seat, ready to work at 10:00AM Mondays and Wednesdays;
- •Being online on Zoom with your video on, ready to work at 10:00AM Tuesdays and Thursdays;
- Being actively engaged in what is going on in the classroom;
- Taking responsibility for your learning process in this class;
- Asking for help when you do not understand something;
- Working willingly and appropriately with your classmates in pairs and groups;
- Listening respectfully when others are talking;
- Doing the homework **before** you come to class;
- Coming back from the break promptly, ready to resume working;
- Not checking or answering your cell phone in class or leaving class to take a call.
- 3. **Quizzes**: You will have several quizzes that will test grammar, listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills.
- 4. **Listening Lab Log**: You are required to complete five hours of listening and speaking practice for homework. These hours must come from your participation in the workshops or tutorial sessions in the Listening and Speaking Center. All five hours must be listening/speaking practice (not grammar). Take a screenshot of your online workshops. Your screenshot must include your picture and the title and date and time of the workshop. If you take a workshop on campus, please get a record of participation from your workshop leader.
- 5. **Exams**: You will have a midterm and comprehensive final exam.

NOTE: No late assignments will be accepted. No make-up quizzes will be given.
