## Discussion points/resolutions from actual meeting follow agenda

#### **OUTCOMES:**

- This meeting will confirm membership of the ICC assessment task force on critical thinking.
- Members will understand the broad scope of the project, and the commitment involved.
- Members will discuss and begin to develop a global rubric for assessing critical thinking across all instructional programs.
- A follow-up meeting, to be held prior to the conclusion of the spring quarter, will be scheduled.
- 1. Introductions

  - b. Interest/motivation for participation in assessment work
- 2. Overview of the project
  - a. The outcomes assessment model
  - b. 'Phase 1': The ICCs

    - i. 2 assessment tools
      - 1. Indirect assessment via institutional research and TracDat
      - 2. Direct assessment via this task force
- 3. The rough plan so far
  - a. Establish a rubric by the end of this year
  - b. Present the rubric at the fall Opening Day presentation of the SLO committee
  - c. Develop an assessment tool to be used in conjunction with course and program-level outcomes assessment data (stored in TracDat) to assess critical thinking against our global rubric (fall 2012)
  - d. Implement the tool and collect data (winter 2013)
  - e. Write a report on our findings and enhancement suggestions to present by the spring of 2013
- 4. The work involved (anticipated, but subject to change)
  - a. 2 quarterly meetings (S12, F12, W13, S13)
  - b. Independent collaboration on tasks we develop at meetings
- 5. Compensation
  - a. Still working to confirm, but anticipating PGA credit for service on the task force
- 6. What to do first
  - a. Establish a rubric that is (potentially) applicable across instructional programs
    - i. This will ultimately be decided by the task force, but should be informed by the suggestions offered by the faculty at large during the April 2012 SLO convocation

- 1. These suggestions have been compiled onto a PDF file that will be made available to all task force members
- 2. A 'rubric template' will also be distributed, and will allow members to gather ideas for the language to be used in the final rubric
- 3. Templates/ideas/suggestions will be brought to the follow-up meeting held later this quarter, at which time the final rubric will be decided
- b. Begin thinking about the 'final product'—what kind of report/presentation do we want to make available to our colleagues when our work concludes in the spring?
- 7. Follow-up meeting: Finals week?

- It has been suggested that we consider recruiting representation on the task force from student services and administrative units
- Preliminary implantation of our assessment tool ('beta testing') will be carried out by task force members in their own classes in the fall
- It has been suggested that we look for examples of other campus-wide assessment tools, and that the recent survey conducted by the ICCE (<u>http://www.deanza.edu/communityengagement/</u>) may be worth examining
