One-to-one communication - emails. Zoom meetings, etc. Students don't want to "bother" us, so we have to reach more than half-way

outreach to range of communitie

sending students to tutoring is not enough. I have office hours in the WRC. so they go.

I email students telling time that i am willing to help anytime. Most of the time, the students do not reply.

I message a lot of reminders to students. They tell me they appreciate it. And, if someone misses two assignments in a row, I invite them to come "see me" and make an appointment so we can chat.

I've gotten way more flexible on making up assignments, but then the students who really struggle often can't take advantage of that.

I will alter assessment dates if I see that there is a pattern where some students are late, just because the∳aren't able to finish the work on time b/c of other commitments. So changing the deadline helps everyone

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There may be pressure from stake-holders, including the learning institution, to use quantitative, standardized assessments. Teaching is a complex act and a course is a complex event. Infrastructure shortcomings make this complexity even greater. Evaluations of clasroom teaching, etc. are often short, 1-2 hours, if in-person observation occurs at all. Thorough processes are needed throughout and at all levels.
