Academic Skills Center Adjunct Study Skills 232 Group Study Activity (GSA) Lab



The purpose of this lab is for students in an Adjunct group to collaborate to create a written Study Activity on specific course content.

Remember, you must submit four labs by 12:30 pm Friday of Week 8 to pass SKIL 232. See Syllabus for exact dates.

Steps:

- 1. With direction from the S.I., the group chooses one learning activity from the list of options. Divide up the work so each group member contributes to the activity. Decide as a group how many questions/problems/terms each person should contribute, and on what topic. Each member's contribution should equal at least one page (200-250 words) of text.
- 2. Each member of the group completes his/her NOTES individually outside of the group session. You may use the Forums section of Catalyst to communicate with each other.
- 3. The following week, each student in the group comes prepared to share his/her NOTES with the rest of the group. In this group session, the S.I. leads members through a review of the study activity components completed by each student.

Group Study Activity Options (or feel free to invent your own...)

- **Learning Game:** Create a game, such as jeopardy or bingo, and write the instructions, goals, and methods. Each member must contribute at least one page worth of questions and answers.
- **Memorization Activity:** Create a set of flash cards, a word bank, or word association game. Each member must contribute at least one page worth of terms and definitions.
- **Problem/Solution Activity:** Create a set of word problems or case studies with solutions. Each member must contribute at least one page with the problem or case study the answer to each word problem.
- **Quiz or Test:** Create 20 questions composed of true/false, multiple choice, and/or fill in the blank. Please include the answers to each quiz or test question.
- **Textbook Study Guide:** Following the instructions from the S.I., review a specific chapter in your textbook or other course materials and write one page of information about the subject/chapter.
