## California State University General Education - Breadth (CSUGE)

All students must meet general education (GE) requirements to receive a bachelor's degree from the California State University (CSU). A minimum of 72 quarter units is required for GE which includes a minimum of 12 units of upper division courses. Students may complete all of the lower-division GE requirements at a California Community College (CCC) before transfer to the CSU.

### CSUGE is a lower-division, 58 quarter unit pattern.

Up to 58 of the 72 general education units required can be certified by a CCC. Students who complete all areas of CSUGE with 58 quarter units may be certified and will not be required to complete any additional lower-division GE course work after transfer. Full certification does not exempt students from any unmet lower division graduation requirements for the campus awarding the BA/BS degree. A CCC can certify each subject area (Area A, B, C, D, E) or the whole pattern.

CSU provides CCC transfer students with two system-wide options for fulfilling CSU lower-division GE requirements: CSUGE and the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC). Students should meet with a counselor to determine which pattern is appropriate.

Though completion of GE is not a transfer admission requirement, most students should make completion of all or most of CSUGE (or IGETC) a priority along with pre-major coursework. Students in high-unit majors such as engineering, some math-based fields, sciences and technical majors are usually advised to focus on fulfilling pre-major course requirements over GE requirements. These students should work closely with a counselor.

De Anza has a unique CSUGE pattern that includes (3) Area-specific requirements: Area C: EWRT 1B or ESL 5; Area D: (HIST 17A or B or C) and POLI 1; and Area C/D: one ICS course. As a result of this CSUGE pattern specific to De Anza, students need to be careful when utilizing transfer tools like CSUMentor's Transfer Student Planner or referencing De Anza's CSUGE information on ASSIST. Please see a counselor/advisor if you have any questions.

To be eligible for upper-division transfer, students must complete 90 transferable quarter units with a grade point average of 2.0 or better (2.4 for California nonresidents)\* in all transferable college units attempted. At least 45 of those units must be CSUGE courses with a grade of C or better in each course, and they must include CSUGE Areas A1, A2, A3 and B4. Note: Some CSU campuses do not allow Areas A and B4 to be completed during the last term prior to transfer. Students must also be in good standing at the last college or university attended. *\* These are minimum requirements to be considered for admission. In the case of high-demand majors/campuses or when enrollment restrictions are enforced, a 2.0 GPA may not be competitive and the level of transfer preparedness may be considered.*

### Courses on CSUGE

- A course must be on CSUGE (in the specified Area) the term it's completed in order to apply. Courses may be added to CSUGE mid-academic year, so students should always refer to the most up-to-date CSUGE pattern when selecting courses each term. Check [www.ASSIST.org](http://www.ASSIST.org) and [http://www.deanza.edu/transfer/csu\\_main/trans\\_reqs\\_csu/ge\\_reqs\\_csu.html](http://www.deanza.edu/transfer/csu_main/trans_reqs_csu/ge_reqs_csu.html) on a regular basis.
- Areas A1, A2, A3 and B4 must be completed with a C or better (C- is not allowed). Though not recommended, a grade of "Credit" or "Pass" may be used if the community college's policy states it is equivalent to a grade of C or better. A "Pass" at De Anza is achieved with a grade of C or better.
- Though a course may be listed in more than one Area, it can only be counted in one Area for certification.

**A few things to consider:** Some CSU campuses set limits on the number of units that may be taken for Credit/Pass. Courses used towards a major must be taken for a letter grade, unless otherwise specified. CSU has campus-specific policies that may not allow courses to be double-counted for major and GE. Check CSU college catalogs and Web sites for campus-specific policies.

### Coursework from Other Colleges

- Courses taken at another California community college (CCC) will be applied in the approved Areas designated by that college when the courses were completed. Check [www.ASSIST.org](http://www.ASSIST.org)
- Courses from regionally accredited institutions could apply towards CSUGE as long as they meet CSUGE criteria and standards.
- Only foreign coursework from US regionally accredited institutions may be applied to CSUGE. Although De Anza will not certify other foreign coursework, a CSU campus may elect to apply them to GE after students have transferred.

Students must arrange to have official transcripts sent to De Anza – Admissions and Records Office (A&R). Once transcripts are on file, students are advised to meet with a counselor to request to have those transcripts evaluated. Evaluation time varies so this process should be initiated as soon as possible. If we are unable to determine the applicability of a non-CCC course towards CSUGE, it is the student's responsibility to provide additional information on the course. Writing samples may be needed for courses reviewed for Areas A2, A3 and the second writing course in Area C.

### CSUGE Certification

The CSUGE certification is an official document sent directly from De Anza to another institution verifying the courses/exams applied to CSUGE. This is not an automatic process. Upon enrolling in final required courses and receiving conditional admissions to the university, students must submit a request for certification to De Anza's Admissions and Records Office. All necessary documentation (transcripts, AP, IB) must be received and evaluated by De Anza prior to this request. Note: The certification process may be delayed if transcripts/exams have not been previously evaluated. (See section on **Coursework from Other Colleges** above)

- International Baccalaureate (IB) – official reports must be sent to De Anza (A&R) directly from the IB Organization in order to apply.
