## Transfer Admission Agreement (TAA)

(Spring 2012, Fall 2012, Spring 2013, and Fall 2013)

### STUDENTS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR TAAS

- Students planning to write or have written a TAA / TAG with another institution
- Students who have attended a four-year college or university and left while on probation or were dismissed
- Students who are currently on academic probation or are disqualified
- Students holding a BA or BS degree
- Students currently working towards a high school diploma
- Students who have attended colleges or universities outside of the U.S.

### TAA ELIGIBILITY & GUIDELINES

1. **Filing Period:** A TAA with NHU may be written for all majors up to two years in advance of the transfer term for both Fall and Spring admission. (Note: The TAA must be processed before the NHU application is submitted)  
TAA Deadline:     January 15 for fall transfers  
                          August 15 for spring transfers
2. **Units:** Students must be currently enrolled at De Anza, have earned at least 18 quarter or 12 semester units of transferable coursework and be in good academic standing with a minimum 2.0 GPA.
3. **Units:** Student must complete a minimum of 45 quarter or 30 semester units of transferable college level coursework with a minimum 2.0 GPA at time of admission to NHU.
4. **Grades:** Only courses with grades of C or better will be accepted, but all transferable courses will count in the GPA calculation.
5. Students must complete and submit an NHU application with all related materials during the appropriate filing period. (See reverse side for application filing periods.)
6. **The minimum required courses for admission to NHU for students following -**  
**CSU GE-Breadth** are: 4-5 quarter units in GE Areas A1, A2, A3, and B4. These courses must be completed prior to transfer.  
**IGETC** are: 4-5 quarter units in each group (A, B, C) of Area 1, and 4-5 quarter units in Area 2. These courses must be completed prior to transfer.
7. **Recommended courses to complete more of NHU's GE breadth requirements and core curriculum:**
  - a) **General Education:** Students should follow the IGETC (for CSU) or the CSU GE Breadth Pattern to complete NHU's GE breadth requirements. Courses for the major identified below could also apply towards GE
  - b) **Foreign Language:** Although NHU recommends completing two Spanish courses, any two language courses taken in sequential order, including American Sign Language, are accepted. For example, SPAN 1 and SPAN 2. (Language courses may be used to fulfill both GE and NHU core requirements).
  - c) **Business Majors:** ECON 1, ECON 2, ACCT 1A and 1B, ACCT 1C, BUS 10, BUS 18, MATH 10.
  - d) **Liberal Studies (Credential Option) Majors:** CHEM 10, CD 10G and 10H, DANC 38, MATH/EDUC 46, SOCS/POLI/WMST 15, SPAN 1, SPAN 2, SPAN 3.
  - e) **Liberal Studies (General Option) Majors:** ICS 31, ANTH 2 or PSYC 1, SPAN 1, SPAN 2, SPAN 3.
  - f) **Child Development Majors:** CD 10G and CD 10H, CD 12, CD 50, CD 52, CD 54, CD 60, CD 64, CD 65.
  - g) Students should refer to the current articulation agreement for transferable elective courses.
8. Students are strongly encouraged to meet with an NHU advisor prior to admissions.

## **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

### **1. Policies for Awarding Transfer Credit:**

With the exception of remedial and non-academic vocational courses, NHU accepts credit for courses completed with grade “C” or higher at any degree-granting-regionally-accredited two-year college or four-year college or university. Courses from California Community Colleges completed with grade “C” or higher are generally accepted according to the published recommendations for transfer of courses to the California State and University of California systems.

2. International students without college credit from institutions outside of the U.S. may qualify for a TAA. English proficiency must be demonstrated by taking the TOEFL (Contact NHU Admissions Office for current minimum scores). TOEFL scores must be sent directly to NHU. Students should be aware of NHU’s admission requirements for international students listed in the NHU catalog.
