

UC San Diego TAG Fall 2010

Details

- California community college students can participate in this guarantee if they complete the requirements and submit a UC application during the filing period for Fall (Nov. 1-30, 2009).
- If you indicate UCSD TAG and [Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum \(IGETC\)](#) on the UC application, you will be guaranteed admission if you meet the TAG requirements. (note: TAG contracts are unnecessary)
- Full completion of IGETC is required. UCSD must receive your IGETC certification form by July 15, 2010.
- TAG does not guarantee your choice of one of UCSD's six colleges. Please rank your college choices on your UC application. (Go to www.UCSD.edu for more information on these colleges)

Eligibility

- You must meet the definition of a California community college (CCC) student applying for admission with junior status (60 UC transferable semester units or 90 UC transferable quarter units completed by Spring 2010 for Fall 2010 TAG applicants)
 - Enrolled at one or more CCCs for at least 2 regular terms (excludes summer sessions)
 - Last college before UCSD admission is a CCC (excludes summer sessions)
 - Completed at least 30 semester (45 quarter) UC transferable units at a CCC
- For Fall 2010 admission, you must earn a cumulative 3.0 minimum UC GPA by the end of Fall term 2009 and maintain a cumulative 3.0 UC GPA through the end of Spring term 2010.
- All students must be in good standing during their last regular term.
- You must complete the required courses in English composition (2 courses designated as UC-E on the UC-TCA) and mathematics (1 course designated with UC-M on the UC-TCA) with C grades or better by the end of Fall 2009.
- This agreement is available to U.S. citizens, permanent residents, AB540 students, and former UC students in good standing (except former UCSD students).
- TAG does not apply to students with senior class standing (students with 90 or more UC transferable semester units or 135 quarter units) from accredited four-year universities and community colleges combined.
 - Students cannot reach senior standing with only community college units completed. A maximum of 70 UC transferable community college semester or 105 quarter units will be accepted toward graduation. Subject credit is awarded for community college units taken beyond the 70 semester units or 105 quarter units.
 - All UC transferable units completed at a 4-year university apply toward the limit of 90 semester units or 135 quarter units.
 - Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate units earned prior to high school graduation do not apply to the limit of 90 semester units or 135 quarter units.

Majors

- TAG applies to general admission but not necessarily to an impacted major. Students must meet the screening criteria for designated majors that require lower division preparation prior to admission into the major.
- For more information about major preparation coursework, see the agreements by major between UCSD and De Anza College on ASSIST (www.ASSIST.org). UCSD strongly advises all transfer students to complete lower-division major requirements.
