We eliminated the massage therapy program in 2019-20 with no enrollments in 2020-21. The engineering degree program saw a 72% increase in enrollment over the prior year. German language also saw a 74% increase in enrollment from 47 to 82 enrollments. Hindi saw a 52% increase in

enrollment from 62 to 94. International studies saw a 56% decrease from 337 to 148. Italian saw a 62% increase from 90 to 146. Persian was not offered in 2020-21 so saw a 100% decrease.
