

Math Guided Self-Placement (GSP) Assessment Overview

Important! Read this before starting your math assessment.

De Anza College uses a “placement” process that is designed to help students find the right Math class for their level of knowledge and understanding. For many students, we can find the right placement by looking at their high school transcripts, if they completed high school in the United States.

Since we don't have a U.S. high school transcript for you, we'd like you to complete this guided self-placement (GSP) survey. Your answers will help us find the right Math class to help you succeed.

Math GSP Computerized Assessment Survey

- **This is not a test.** There are no wrong answers. The questions in this survey will help us understand your current level of Math skills and knowledge.
- As you work your way through this survey, you are encouraged to reflect upon your academic history and educational goals as well as your familiarity and comfort with math topics.
- This should take you about a 30-45 minutes to complete.
- You only need to complete the Math guided self-placement process once. But, if you feel you'd like to attempt the GSP again after reviewing your results, you can do so **one** additional time **within** six months of today's date assuming you have not earned a non-passing grade in a math class.
 - For example: If you took your first math assessment on January 1, 2020, you are eligible to take the assessment one additional time **before** July 2, 2020.

At the end of your assessment session, we'll tell you which math courses you're eligible for.

- Once you get your results you'll need to complete the [New Student Orientation](#) so that you understand which math courses are required for your **major** and **educational goals**.

Ready to get started? Great!

- Log in using your **De Anza Campus Wide ID (CWID) Number** and **MyPortal Password** to begin the GSP Survey.
If you have forgotten your password, we'll need you to reset it at the MyPortal Password Set-Up/Reset Station at the front of the lab. Raise your hand for assistance.
- **Remember!** This is not a test.
- You can use scratch paper to organize your thoughts.
- No dictionaries, notes, calculators, access to the internet or other aids are allowed during the assessment.
