DE ANZA COLLEGE BUSINESS/COMPUTER SYSTEMS DIVISION BUSINESS 10 - INTRODUCTION TO BUSINESS FALL 2014 – SECTION 2 INSTRUCTOR: BYRON LILLY

Course Objectives: To introduce the student to basic business terminology, operations, and principles, including an introduction to the functions performed both by and within modern business establishments. Topics include management, accounting, economics, marketing, international business, starting and running a small business, and business ethics.

Required Materials:

- Textbook: <u>Understanding Business</u>, 9th edition Nickels, McHugh & McHugh Irwin / McGraw-Hill. (ISBN 978-0-07-351170-2).
- Alternate textbook: <u>Understanding Business, Paperback International Edition</u> Nickels, McHugh & McHugh (ISBN 978-0-07-131410-7)
- Test supplies: Four 8 ¹/₂" x 11" *ParSCORE Score Sheets* (for the in-class exams) and a #2 (soft lead) pencil. ParSCORE score sheets are available for sale at the De Anza College bookstore.

Course Requirements:

• <u>Attendance:</u> Class meets twice a week, and attendance is required. Attendance will be called every day at the beginning of class. If you are late to class, come see me either at the ten minute break (midway point) or at the end of class and let me know that you are there. I will ask you what time you arrived. If you have to leave class **early**, please send me an email telling me what time you left the classroom. If you will not be attending a class, or miss a class, *you must* send me an email with the reason for your absence – otherwise you run the risk of being dropped from the class.

There are four ways to get dropped from this class. All are based on attendance. Please read these very carefully and make sure you remain in compliance with them, because if I drop you after the start of the third week, *you will not be able to add back this quarter!*

- 1. If I mark you absent 2 or more class periods in a row prior to Nov. 14 and have not received an email from you explaining either of these absences, I will drop you.
- 2. If you miss three classes or more before the end of the third week (Oct. 12, 2014), I will drop you.
- 3. Beginning at the start of the 4th week (Oct. 13, 2014) and ending Nov. 14, if your attendance falls below 70% *and* your current grade in the class is a D+ or lower, I will drop you.
- 4. And finally, if at any time you owe me two exams, I will drop you; so if you miss an in-class exam, you must make it up in my office before the next exam occurs to avoid being dropped.
- **<u>Reading assignments</u>**: Completion of the reading assignments is essential for successful performance on the examinations.
- Access to the Internet: Access to the Internet is required for this class. The online quizzes

will count for 20% of your course grade. You can use your own home computer for Internet access; or, if you prefer, you can use the computers in the Library West Computer Lab. The Library West Computer Lab is located downstairs in (the basement of) the Learning Center West (LCW) building.

- <u>Homework</u>: Homework consists of **reading assignments** plus **online quizzes**. Online quizzes are required. These quizzes are open book, open note, but you are **strictly forbidden** to take the quizzes in groups, assist other students in taking the quizzes, or solicit the assistance of other students in taking the quizzes. You must take the quizzes **entirely on your own**. Please carefully review the daily lesson plan at the end of this green sheet for the online quiz due dates. There are *no makeups* for the online quizzes. If you do not take a quiz by the due date *for any reason*, that quiz will be *excluded* from the calculation of your quiz grade, but *your course grade will be lowered by* one-eighth (1/8th) of one percentage point *for each quiz you miss*. The most the online quizzes can lower your course grade is four percentage points. The most they can raise it is three percentage points. The online quizzes are located in De Anza's **Catalyst** system. There is no cost to access the materials in this system.
- Examinations: There will be four required in-class exams. None will be dropped. All exams are closed-book, closed-note. If you know you will be absent on the day of an exam, please make arrangements with me to take the exam *early, before* the rest of the class. That way, you will not be assessed a lateness penalty. You will be assessed a *lateness penalty* for *any* exams you take *after* the rest of the class *for any reason*. Lateness penalties are assessed at a rate of 5 percentage points per full or partial week later than the rest of the class that you take an exam. If you miss an exam, please contact me ASAP to schedule a make up exam. Note that the time slots available for makeup exams are limited. I expect all students who miss one of the first 3 exams to *contact* me within two days of missing an exam and *take* the makeup exam on the first date that they arrange. Students who miss the final exam must contact me within two hours of missing that exam and must make it up within 24 hours of missing it to avoid a zero.

Exam Re-takes:

• A student who receives a D+ or below on Exams 1 or 2 (69% or below) can make themselves eligible for a re-take of that exam only by working the decks in the five chapters that are covered on that quiz down to zero in the LearnSmart tool. Exam re-takes are taken in the hallway of Mr. Lilly's office building by appointment. A student who completes an Exam re-take will receive the higher of their original score on that Exam or their re-take score.

Extra Credit:

Extra credit points are approximately as valuable as points earned in Catalyst (weekly online quizzes.) It takes 60 extra credit points to raise your course grade by one percentage point.

- **Prologue Lecture Quiz** The Prologue lecture and lecture quiz are entirely optional, but you can earn up to 9 extra credit points by completing it by the deadline, which is 11:55PM Sunday, September 28.
- LearnSmart You will earn 5 extra credit points for each assigned chapter you "work the deck down to zero" for in the optional LearnSmart tool. Access to this tool will cost you an extra \$35 for the quarter. The tool contains one module for each assigned chapter in the textbook. It keeps drilling you on the material until you know it. It notices which questions

you've answered correctly, stops asking you questions about things you've mastered, and keeps asking you questions about things you have not yet mastered. Not only can you earn up to 75 extra credit points with this tool, but it is also useful for certain other purposes – notably to make yourself eligible to repeat an exam you didn't pass, to erase an absence, and to erase a set of missed-quiz penalties for a chapter's-worth of Catalyst quizzes. Working a single chapter deck "down to zero" could in theory be used in all four of these ways simultaneously.

Some of the Other Resources Available to Help You Succeed in This Class:

- There are two copies of the textbook on reserve at the De Anza Library. You can only check them out for 2 hours at a time, and there are no overnight checkouts, but it's an option if you're on a really tight budget. Ask at the library circulation desk for details on how to check them out.
- Students who believe they might have a learning disability are encouraged to make arrangements with the Disabled Student Services department at (408) 864-8753 for extra time on exams. Note that you *must* contact them within the *first two weeks of classes* or they will generally not accommodate your request to be assessed for learning disabilities. If you have already been assessed by them in a previous quarter, then I believe you can contact them later in the quarter and receive services.

Grading Policy:

Each student's course grade will be calculated as a **weighted average** of 5 grade **components**, with the weights as follows:

Letter grades will be assigned to students based on their total course grade, which is calculated as a weighted average of the grading components, as described above.

If you do not want to continue in the class, be sure to use the MyPortal system to drop the class by November 14, otherwise *you will be stuck in the class.* **State law forbids me from dropping you after November 14 for any reason.** Your only option after that date is to request an incomplete grade. But you will only **qualify** for an **incomplete grade** if **you can <u>prove</u> an unforeseen**, **unavoidable circumstance** that makes it **impossible** for you to finish the class, such as being called up for active duty by the National Guard, or being hospitalized. Less dire circumstances generally do not qualify for an incomplete.
