DE ANZA COLLEGE BUSINESS/COMPUTER SYSTEMS DIVISION BUSINESS 10 - INTRODUCTION TO BUSINESS SECTIONS 62Z and 66Z (Distance Learning) FALL 2014 INSTRUCTOR: BYRON LILLY

Course Objectives: This is an introductory level course designed to introduce the student to basic business terminology, operations, and principles, including an introduction to the functions performed both by and within modern business establishments. Topics include management, accounting, economics, marketing, international business, starting and running a small business, and business ethics.

Required Materials:

- Textbook: <u>Understanding Business</u>, 9th edition Nickels, McHugh & McHugh Irwin / McGraw-Hill. (ISBN 978-0-07-351170-2).
- Alternate textbook: <u>Understanding Business, Paperback International Edition</u> Nickels, McHugh & McHugh (ISBN 978-0-07-131410-7)

Course Requirements:

- <u>Access to the Internet/Getting Started:</u> Access to the Internet is required for this class. This class is offered through De Anza's standard distance learning system, Catalyst. The entry point for the course website is <u>https://catalyst.deanza.edu</u>. Instructions for logging into the Catalyst system, if you have never used it before, can be found at <u>https://catalyst.deanza.edu/?pg=first</u>.
- <u>Orientation videos</u>: You will find a collection of orientation videos inside the course website in Catalyst, near the top of the page, grouped under the heading "Course Syllabus and Orientation Videos." It is **really important** that you watch these videos! These videos will explain how you earn points in the class.
- <u>Required Reading, Online Lectures, and Online Quizzes:</u> The reading assignments in the textbook, the online lectures, and the online quizzes associated with each of the 15 assigned chapters are the "main events" in this course. This is where the course material will be delivered to you, and where you will earn half your grade in the class. You will earn the other half by taking the final exam. The online quizzes are due in one- or two-chapter "bunches" on Sunday nights, and cannot be taken late. If you miss the deadline for a set of online quizzes, you can recover 80% of the points you missed by completing a set of questions in a tool called "LearnSmart."
- <u>Attendance</u>: The attendance requirement for this class is that you must have a "letter grade so far" of at least a C (70% of the points possible) on **each Monday** between September 29 and November 10 (7 Mondays in all); otherwise, you will be dropped from the course for "inadequate attendance."
- <u>Final Examination</u>: This class has a required **on-campus final examination** worth 50% of the course grade. Only students who live more than 35 miles away from the De Anza campus, and who prove they live that far away by Wednesday December 3, 2014, will be permitted to take an alternate, online final examination. The required on-campus final examination will be administered twice on the De Anza campus. You only need to take it once, can take it either time, and do not need to let me know in advance which time you have chosen. The two times

are: Thursday, December 11, 2014 from 11:30AM to 1:30PM, and Friday, December 12, from 9:15AM to 11:15AM. Both times will be in the same location: classroom Forum 3 on the De Anza College campus, 21250 Stevens Creek Blvd., Cupertino, CA 95014. *If for some reason neither of these times will work for you, you must contact me by Wednesday December 3*, 2014 to make alternate arrangements.

Strongly Recommended:

* Online Orientation: It is strongly recommended that you print and carefully read at least the first page of the online orientation by Monday, September 22, 2014. To find this first page, go to <u>http://www.deanza.edu/distance</u>, click the link "Online Orientation" within the "Fall 2014 links" group, then click *either* the link for "BUS -D010.-62Z with Byron Lilly" *or* "BUS - D010.-66Z with Byron Lilly". Either of these links will bring you to the same online orientation.

LearnSmart:

• LearnSmart is a separate, optional website that you have to pay \$35 for the quarter to use. It is not required, but it is the only way to (at least partially) make up for missed online quizzes. If you miss a set of online quizzes, but complete 100% of the questions in the corresponding chapter module in LearnSmart, you will receive 80% of the points possible on that chapter's required quizzes. (That's the most you can receive via LearnSmart.) If you complete *less than 100%* of the questions in a given chapter module in LearnSmart, you will receive *X% times* 80% of the points that were possible on that chapter's required quizzes, *where X is the percentage* of the LearnSmart module *you completed*. So for example, if you missed the chapter 1 required quizzes but completed 90% of the chapter 1 LearnSmart module, you would earn 72% of the points possible on chapter 1's required quizzes, because 90% x 80% = 72%.

General Information:

- * You can use computers on the De Anza campus if you want: Access to the Internet is required for this class. You can use your own home computer for Internet access; or, if you prefer, you can use the computers in the Library West Computer Lab. The Library West Computer Lab is located downstairs in (the basement of) the Learning Center West (LCW) building.
- * Last date to drop with a W: You are solely responsible for <u>dropping the course by Friday</u>, <u>November 14, 2014</u> if you do not want to continue in the course. Late drops (drops attempted after November 14, 2014) will not be accepted.

Grading Policy:

Each student's course grade will be calculated as an equally-weighted average of two components: the online grade and the final exam grade. Each component will be calculated as the ratio between the points earned on that component and the points possible on that component. The average of the two components will be used to determine the student's letter grade according to the following table. Decimal fractions of .5 or higher will be rounded up to the nearest whole percentage. Decimal fractions of .4999 or lower will be rounded down to the nearest whole percentage.
