Course description:

Theory, practice, and procedures relating to the preparation and use of accounting records and reports. Emphasis on service and mercantile-oriented enterprises. This course concentrates on the Priciples of Accounting, the usage of debits and credits, the analysis of business transactions, the completed counting cycle, the preparation of the basic financial statements, princples of inventory, the preparation of bank reconciliations, and the calculation and interpretation of basic financial analysis. (Chapters 1-9)

Student Learning Outcomes:

- 1) Demonstrate knowledge of double entry accounting for business transactions and adjustments.
- 2) Prepare, explain, and analyze an income statement, statement of owner's equity and balance sheet using GAAP and identify the various users of financial statements.
- 3) Identify ethical issues in an accounting context.
- 4) Analyze fundamental business concepts, how businesses operate and how accounting serves them.

Midterms:

Quizzes - 40 points

Chapter quizzes will not be announced. These in-class quizzes will be closed book and closed notes. There will be no makeup for missed quizzes. The quizzes will range in value from 7 to 10 points. There will be more than 40 points available throughout the quarter.

Homework - 40 points

Homework will be computerized, on-line, and manually done. The computer HW will be done in class and accepted only on that day. The online HW will be graded by the CengageNow. Manual homework will be accepted only on the assigned day during the first 15 minutes of class. You must turn in a **photo copy** of your original manual homework. Homework assignment will be worth from 1-5 points. There will be no credit for partially completed homework. Again, there will be more than 40 points available, to make your total of 40 points.

There will be one group project assignment due. You will be graded on your cooperation within the group and on the successful completion of the project.
