- 3. Extract information from a database program.

REQUIRED COURSE MATERIALS

1. Textbook:

SimNet Registration Code Required. There are **two purchase options** for your SimNet code (online or in the bookstore). I recommend purchasing your code online to receive a discounted price. **IM PORTANT:** See the **end of this syllabus** for links to the step-by-step directions on how to **purchase** and **register** your SimNet account and start your SimNet course.

Note to Financial aid students: If haven't received funding yet, you can start your course with a 21-day trial period if you purchase through the bookstore. IM PORTANT: If you use the 21-day trial, you must purchase the full software BEFORE Thursday OF THE FIRST WEEK OF SCHOOL. I cannot see students in my Gradebook who are on the 21-day free trial—therefore, you will be dropped if you have not upgraded to the full version of the software by the first Thursday of the quarter. Furthermore, because I cannot see the work of those on the trial, you will need to identify yourself as a financial aid student to me and show me that you have completed your work. Failure to identify yourself as being on the 21-day free trial will result in your being dropped.

- 2. **High speed internet connection** (not dial up) required IF you work at home.
- 3. **Headset**: Any headset with 1/8" connector plug if you work in the CIS lab.

REQUIRED COMPUTER COMPONENTS AND AVAILABILITY

Email: You will need an email account in which you can send and receive e-mail. If you don't have an email account, set one up before the course begins.

Internet/Browsers: Most assignments in the course require you to use the Internet. The SimNet website that you will be accessing requires a high-speed Internet connection. Since browser requirements may change; if necessary, please go to deanza. SimNetonline.com for most recent browser requirements.

Hardware Requirements: A PC or Macintosh computer is required.

^{*} You do **NOT** need to have Microsoft Office software installed on your computer to complete this course.

Software: None required. You DO NOT need to have the Microsoft Office Suite installed on your computer. You will be accessing a Web site called deanza. SimNetonline.com (SimNet) that will simulate the Office Suite.

SUBMITTING WEEKLY SIMNET LAB ASSIGNMENTS
