The Adapted Physical Education (APE) program provides a safe and encouraging environment for De Anza students with disabilities to engage in physical activity. Our program offers a broad range of courses to meet the fitness needs of our students. The curriculum is designed to accommodate personal fitness goals through individual instruction as well as appropriate group instruction. Classes are held on campus in a large dedicated gym or accessible pool, as well as offsite classes in the community.

(250 words max)	With the help of the APE faculty and staff, our students get to set realistic goals. Over time, our students are able to reach and exceed those goals. Students who are new to our program are often very excited to get started because of what we offer and how we can accommodate their needs. Since students with verified disabilities can repeat our courses, they are able to develop lasting relationships with us as educators, as well as create friendships amongst their peers. We help serve the community by partnering with local agencies such as HOPE services, Cupertino Senior Center, Community Options and Santa Clara Valley Medical Center.
