Title: Renter's Rights & Rent Stabilization Resolution

This item is to vote on passing a resolution to support Renter's Rights & Stabilization in San Jose.

Presenter: Thao Le Time: 30 minutes

- Naeema moved to table item 5 and 6.

- Thao presented the resolution
- Whereas, 49.3% of students at De Anza College live in San Jose according to a Fall 2013 Census
- Whereas, 57% of De Anza College students have a family income ranging from "No Income" to "Lower Middle Income" (\$25,000 \$50,000) according to the same census;
- Whereas, the average rent in San Jose has increased by 60% in the past five years while wages have increased only by 11%;
- Whereas, the housing crisis in the Silicon Valley has caused overcrowding, gentrification, displacement, homelessness, and a host of other humanitarian issues;
- Whereas, a study published in The National Bureau of Economic Research found that in areas with a housing boom, university enrollment dramatically slows down, especially in the case of community colleges;
- Whereas, the De Anza Associated Student Body Senate are elected representatives at the College, District, State, and Federal levels for the students of De Anza College;
- Resolved, that the De Anza Associated Student Body Senate endorse, support, and advocate for the demands made to the San Jose City Council by the Renters' Rights Coalition of the Silicon Valley; and
- Resolved, that the De Anza Associated Student Body Senate also urge other local ASOs with high enrollment of San Jose students to also endorse, support, and advocate for this resolution.
- Marco said DASB will have a responsibility to get other ASBs to endorse the resolution and Thao will assist with that.
- Naeema moved to pass the resolution to support Renter's Rights & Stabilization in San Jose.
