### What student concerns do you feel the DASB should address?

Additionally, Student feedback from professors have dropped a large amount since the pandemic. Of the students that I've talked to who have stated that teachers posed a challenge to their success, many stated the lack of communication on the part of the instructor and the late grading which left students in the dark in terms of their progress.

Lastly, a personal concern of mine since the beginning of my tenure at De Anza was the thoughtless use on the "biodegradable" utensils that has been used in the cafeteria. Not only are many of these "biodegradable" utensils unable to be recycled, they don't degrade as stated, in landfills and natural environments. Many of the single stream recycling plants end up throwing away these plastic utensils to landfills which in some ways, make them worse than traditional plastics. As a senator, I will make sure the following issues are addressed accordingly and resolved appropriately."
